14	(a) Renewal termA volunteer license shall be subject to
15	biennial renewal.
16	(b) Fee exemptionHolders of volunteer licenses shall be
17	exempt from renewal fees imposed by the appropriate licensing
18	board. [Volunteer]
19	(c) Continuing educationExcept as set forth in subsection

(d), volunteer licensees shall comply with any continuing
education requirements imposed by board rulemaking as a general
condition of biennial renewal.

(d) Physicians.--Volunteer licensees who are physicians 4 5 shall complete a minimum of 20 credit hours of American Medical Association Physician's Recognition Award Category 2 activities 6 during the preceding biennial period as a condition of biennial 7 8 renewal and are otherwise exempt from any continuing education 9 requirement imposed by section 910 of the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and 10 Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, or by board rulemaking. 11 (e) Disciplinary matters.--In the enforcement of 12 13 disciplinary matters, holders of volunteer licenses shall be subject to those standards of conduct applicable to all 14 licensees licensed by the appropriate board. 15 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
