AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for number and election of board of school directors in school districts of the second, third and fourth classes and for terms of their offices.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 303(a) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended December 17, 1982 (P.L.1378, No.316), is amended to read:

Section 303. Number and Election in Districts of the Second, Third and Fourth Classes; Terms of Office.--(a) (1) In each school district of the second class, and on and after July 1, 1966, or if there is advance establishment July 1, 1964, or July 1, 1965, as the case may be, in each school district of the second, third and fourth class, there shall be a board of nine
(9) school directors, who, except as otherwise provided in this act, shall be elected at large for terms of six (6) years. The terms of three of the members shall expire on the first Monday of December of each odd numbered year, as now provided by law. At each municipal election, three school directors, except as otherwise provided in this act, shall be elected at large for terms of six (6) years. Their terms of office shall begin on the first Monday of December following their election.
(2) Beginning with the terms to be filled at the municipal election held in 1979 and each odd numbered year [thereafter] through 2005, the terms of school directors so elected shall be four (4) years, except that at the municipal election in 1983, five (5) school directors shall be elected for terms of four (4) years and one (1) for a term of two (2) years. At the municipal election in 1985 and every four (4) years [thereafter] through 1999, four (4) directors shall be elected for terms of four (4) years. At the municipal election in 1987 and every four (4) years [thereafter] through 2005, five (5) directors shall be elected for terms of four (4) years. The board shall select by lot, prior to the time for filing of nomination petitions, the vacancy that is to be filled for a two (2) year term in 1983.
(3) Beginning with the terms to be filled at the municipal election held in 2007 and each odd numbered year thereafter, the terms of school directors so elected shall be six (6) years, except that at the municipal election in 2007 and every six (6) years thereafter, four (4) directors shall be elected for terms of six (6) years. At the municipal election in 2009 and every six (6) years thereafter, five (5) directors shall be elected for terms of six (6) years.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
