AN ACT

- Providing for demonstration programs and grants; providing for the establishment of an advisory committee; authorizing the Department of Education to administer funding of the selected
- 4 demonstration projects; and establishing the Horticultural
- 5 Education and Demonstration Fund.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Horticultural
- 10 Education and Demonstration Act.
- 11 Section 2. Legislative findings.
- 12 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 13 (1) The horticultural industry is comprised of numerous
- 14 sectors of the agricultural economy, including vegetable
- 15 growers, fruit growers, nurseries, Christmas tree growers,
- 16 flower growers, sod growers, lawn care professionals and
- 17 landscape architects.
- 18 (2) All citizens of this Commonwealth benefit from the
- 19 products and services provided by the horticultural industry.

- 1 (3) The horticultural industry contributes to the
- 2 overall success of agriculture in this Commonwealth.
- 3 (4) Horticulture is a lifelong learning activity and
- 4 home horticulture is one of the leading leisure activities in
- 5 the country.
- 6 (5) To ensure that Pennsylvania remains a leader in the
- 7 horticultural industry, horticultural sciences must be
- 8 integrated into environmental education so that natural
- 9 resources are protected and the future demand for
- 10 horticultural products can be met.
- 11 (6) Horticultural education is essential if the
- 12 Commonwealth is to meet the environmental, social and
- economic challenges facing the horticultural industry.
- 14 (7) Collaborative efforts to integrate horticulture and
- environmental education in the classroom can be beneficial to
- 16 all students.
- 17 Section 3. Legislative purpose.
- 18 It is the purpose of this act to:
- 19 (1) Require The Pennsylvania State University's
- 20 Cooperative Extension Service and Department of Horticulture,
- 21 the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Conservation
- 22 and Natural Resources, the department, the Department of
- 23 Environmental Protection and school districts to develop and
- implement regional horticultural demonstration programs for
- 25 citizens and students of this Commonwealth.
- 26 (2) Encourage the efforts and cooperation of other
- 27 schools, organizations and agencies where appropriate.
- 28 (3) Provide funding for the development of regional
- 29 horticultural demonstration programs.
- 30 Section 4. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 2 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 "Committee." The Horticultural Advisory and Review Committee
- 5 established under section 5.
- 6 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 7 Commonwealth.
- 8 "Fund." The Horticultural Education and Demonstration Fund
- 9 established by this act.
- 10 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 11 Section 5. Horticultural Advisory and Review Committee.
- 12 (a) Establishment. -- The Horticultural Advisory and Review
- 13 Committee is established. The committee has the following
- 14 duties:
- 15 (1) Review proposals and take into account any comments
- submitted by a school district affected by the proposal.
- 17 (2) Recommend to the department a prioritization for
- 18 funding proposals.
- 19 (3) Recommend to the department proposals for funding in
- 20 accordance with section 8.
- 21 (4) Advise the department on any activities authorized
- 22 by this act.
- 23 (b) Membership.--The committee shall be made up of the
- 24 following members:
- 25 (1) The secretary or a designee.
- 26 (2) The Secretary of Conservation and Natural Resources
- or a designee.
- 28 (3) The Secretary of Environmental Protection or a
- designee.
- 30 (4) The Secretary of Agriculture or a designee.

- 1 (5) The Director of The Pennsylvania State University's
- 2 Cooperative Extension Service or a designee.
- 3 (6) The head of the Department of Horticulture of The
- 4 Pennsylvania State University or a designee.
- 5 (7) Three members representing Statewide or regional
- 6 horticultural organizations appointed by the Secretary of
- 7 Agriculture.
- 8 (8) Three members representing basic education appointed
- 9 by the secretary.
- 10 (9) Two members representing Statewide environmental
- organizations appointed jointly by the Secretary of
- 12 Environmental Protection and Secretary of Conservation and
- 13 Natural Resources.
- 14 Section 6. Responsibilities of the Department of Education.
- 15 The department shall have the duty to:
- 16 (1) Review and approve six horticultural demonstration
- 17 projects.
- 18 (2) Ensure that the demonstration projects are located
- 19 in regions of this Commonwealth known for their horticultural
- 20 products.
- 21 (3) Select the demonstration projects after consulting
- 22 with the committee.
- 23 (4) Enter into grant agreements with grantees.
- 24 Section 7. Scope.
- 25 The money authorized by this act shall be disbursed only to
- 26 school districts involved in horticultural projects and
- 27 activities. Any school district seeking funding for
- 28 demonstration projects shall coordinate its proposal with the
- 29 county cooperative extension office in which the proposed
- 30 demonstration project is located.

- 1 Section 8. Horticultural Education and Demonstration Fund.
- 2 (a) Establishment.--There is established a restricted fund
- 3 in the State Treasury to be known as the Horticultural Education
- 4 and Demonstration Fund. Upon approval of the Governor, funds may
- 5 be deposited or transferred into this fund at the beginning of
- 6 each fiscal year from sources which are consistent with the
- 7 proposed uses specified under this act. The fund may be
- 8 supplemented by appropriations from the General Assembly; the
- 9 Federal, State or local government; or any private source.
- 10 (b) Grants.--All money placed in the fund are hereby
- 11 appropriated to the Department of Education on a continuing
- 12 basis for the purpose of providing grants to eligible school
- 13 districts for horticultural demonstration projects.
- 14 Section 9. Proposal approval process.
- 15 (a) Proposal for grants.--
- 16 (1) School districts interested in receiving grants
- under this act shall submit a proposal to the department and
- 18 shall notify and consult with the county cooperative
- 19 extension office in which a project is proposed that a
- 20 proposal has been submitted. The proposal shall contain
- 21 necessary and appropriate information as required by the
- 22 department.
- 23 (2) The department shall forward to the committee all
- 24 proposals which are received.
- 25 (b) Funding recommendations. -- The committee shall review all
- 26 proposals and make funding recommendations to the department.
- 27 (c) Departmental decisions. -- The department shall consider
- 28 the committee's recommendations in making proposal funding
- 29 decisions. The department shall issue grants to school
- 30 districts.

- 1 (d) School districts receiving funds. -- School districts that
- 2 receive funding under this act shall comply with all applicable
- 3 laws.
- 4 (e) Limitations on funding. -- Nothing contained in this act
- 5 shall require or authorize the secretary to provide any funding
- 6 in excess of the money available under section 8.
- 7 (f) Departmental conditions.--A grant awarded under this
- 8 section shall be subject to terms and conditions as established
- 9 by the department.
- 10 Section 10. Report on activity.
- 11 The department and committee shall prepare an annual report
- 12 identifying available funding, number of projects proposed,
- 13 number of school districts participating and any other
- 14 information deemed appropriate and shall submit the report to
- 15 the General Assembly.
- 16 Section 30. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
