AN ACT

1 2	Providing for data collection relating to dropouts by the Department of Education.
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14	Section 1101. Effective date.
15	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
16	hereby enacts as follows:

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1	CHAPTER 1
2	PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS
3	Section 101. Short title.
4	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Drop-out Data
5	Collection Act.
6	Section 102. Findings.
7	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
8	(1) Significant discrepancies in school district
9	reporting, drop-out statistics and graduation rate formulas
10	exist nationwide.
11	(2) The United States Secretary of Education recently
12	announced that the United States Department of Education will
13	require all states to use a Federal formula for the
14	calculation of drop-out and graduation rates.
15	(3) The Pennsylvania Department of Education's
16	statistics between the 1995–1996 and 2005–2006 school years
17	show that drop-out rates in this Commonwealth may have
18	decreased Statewide, but serious questions exist regarding
19	the uniformity in reporting, and therefore, the reliability
20	of that data.
21	Section 103. Definitions.
22	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
23	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
24	context clearly indicates otherwise:
25	"Charter school." The term shall have the same meaning as in
26	section 1703-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14),
27	known as the Public School Code of 1949.
28	"Cyber charter school." The term shall have the same meaning
29	as in section 1703-A of act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14),
30	known as the Public School Code of 1949.

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1 "Department." The Department of Education of the

2 Commonwealth.

3 "Graduation gap." The percentage of students who entered the 4 ninth grade and did not graduate from the same high school in 5 the same school district four years later.

6 "School district." The term shall have the same meaning as
7 in section 102 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14),
8 known as the Public School Code of 1949.

9 "School entity." The term shall have the same meaning as in 10 section 1101-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), 11 known as the Public School Code of 1949.

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## CHAPTER 3

DATA COLLECTION

14 Section 301. Powers and duties.

15 The department shall have the following powers and duties: 16 (1) To create by the 2009-2010 school year a Statewide 17 definition of "dropout," if none is provided by Federal 18 statute, regulation or guideline and, in accordance with any 19 Federal statute, regulation or guideline, report the 20 graduation rates, drop-out rates and graduation-gap rates in 21 this Commonwealth.

22 To implement and maintain a high-quality data (2) 23 collection and reporting system that accurately accounts for 24 all students when calculating high school graduation and 25 drop-out rates in accordance with Federal regulations or 26 quidelines. The reporting system shall include the 27 calculation of graduation rates, drop-out rates and the 28 graduation-gap rates in all school entities, charter schools 29 and cyber charter schools.

30 (3) To serve as a clearinghouse of information, policies 20090HB1618PN2016 - 3 -

1 and strategies aimed at decreasing the number of dropouts. 2 (4) To require school entities, charter schools and 3 cyber charter schools to report student drop-out information to the department using the department's data collection 4 5 system. Section 302. Data collection and reporting. 6 7 (a) Categories. -- Pursuant to section 301, data collected by 8 the department on drop-out rates, graduation rates and graduation-gap rates shall be disaggregated in the following 9 10 categories: 11 (1)Limited English proficiency. 12 (2)Low income. 13 (3) Special education. 14 (4) Gifted education. 15 (5) Race/ethnicity. 16 School entity. (6) 17 (7) Charter school or cyber charter school. 18 (8) Gender. 19 (9) Geographic area. 20 (10) Other categories as determined by the department. 21 (b) Availability.--The department shall ensure that the data 22 collection and reporting system be accurate, uniform and 23 accessible to school entities, charter schools, cyber charter 24 schools and Commonwealth residents via the department's publicly accessible Internet website. 25 26 CHAPTER 7 27 ADMINISTRATION 28 Section 701. Reporting. 29 Beginning in the 2010-2011 school year and each school year 30 thereafter, the department shall annually prepare a report and 20090HB1618PN2016

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provide a copy of the report to the Education Committee of the
 Senate and the Education Committee of the House of
 Representatives and shall post a copy of the report on the
 department's publicly accessible Internet website by September 1
 of each year, that contains, at a minimum, the following:

6 (1) All drop-out rates, graduation rates and graduation-7 gap rates reported by school entities, charter schools and 8 cyber charter schools, including school-level data, 9 disaggregated by the factors used to identify an at-risk 10 student and the following classifications:

11 (i) Limited English proficiency.

12 (ii) Low income.

13 (iii) Special education.

- 14 (iv) Gifted education.
- 15 (v) Race/ethnicity.
- 16 (vi) Gender.

17 (vii) School entity.

18 (viii) Geographic area.

19 (2) Highest grade level completed and age prior to20 dropping out.

21 Uniform reporting. -- School entities, charter schools and (b) 22 cyber charter schools shall use the definitions and formulas 23 established by the department if no Federal statute, regulation 24 or quideline exists when reporting the graduation rates, 25 drop-out rates and graduation-gap rates to the department. 26 School entities, charter schools and cyber charter schools shall 27 report these rates annually, as required by the department, on a 28 form to be developed and provided by the department. 29 Guidelines and standards. -- The department may develop (C)

30 any guidelines or standards necessary to implement the

2	CHAPTER 11
3	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
4	Section 1101. Effective date.
5	This act shall take effect July 1, 2009, or immediately,
6	whichever is later.
