AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 20, 2002 (P.L.154, No.13), entitled "An act reforming the law on medical professional liability; 3 providing for patient safety and reporting; establishing the Patient Safety Authority and the Patient Safety Trust Fund; abrogating regulations; providing for medical professional liability informed consent, damages, expert qualifications, 6 limitations of actions and medical records; establishing the 7 8 Interbranch Commission on Venue; providing for medical 9 professional liability insurance; establishing the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error Fund; providing for 10 medical professional liability claims; establishing the Joint 11 Underwriting Association; regulating medical professional 12 liability insurance; providing for medical licensure 13 14 regulation; providing for administration; imposing penalties; and making repeals," further providing for continuing medical 15 education. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 20 (P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and
- 21 Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, is amended by adding a
- subsection to read: 2.2
- 23 Section 910. Continuing medical education.

2	(b.1) Additional medical education
3	(1) As part of the 100 hours of mandatory continuing
4	education required of individuals licensed to practice
5	medicine and surgery, 12 hours shall be in the subjects of
6	palliative care and the treatment of terminally ill and dying
7	<pre>patients including:</pre>
8	(i) Management of pain and other symptoms such as
9	nausea, insomnia, shortness of breath, delirium and loss
10	of appetite.
11	(ii) Communication with seriously ill patients.
12	(iii) Assessment of prognosis in seriously or
13	chronically ill patients.
14	(iv) Advance planning and medical decision making.
15	(2) For the purpose of this subsection, the 12 hours of
16	continuing education shall be a one-time requirement.
17	Individuals licensed to practice medicine and surgery without
18	restriction shall complete the 12 hours of continuing
19	education during a biennial renewal cycle before December 31,
20	2016. The board may verify completion of this requirement on
21	the renewal form.
22	(3) As determined by the licensure board, individuals
23	licensed to practice medicine and surgery without restriction
24	may be exempt from the requirement in this subsection if the
25	license does not treat patients or provide patient
26	consultations.
27	(4) For a physician who routinely cares for children for
28	more than 15% of the physician's clinical volume, at least
29	four of the twelve credits shall address the specific

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concerns of pediatric palliative care.

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- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
