## A RESOLUTION

1 Designating June 26, 2010, as the "Thirteenth Annual National  
2 Moment of Silence Day" in Pennsylvania and urging emergency  
3 medical service providers and agencies throughout this  
4 Commonwealth to observe a special moment of silence in honor  
5 of those emergency medical service personnel who have died in  
6 the line of duty.

7 WHEREAS, The National EMS Memorial Service plans to hold a  
8 memorial event on June 26, 2010, at the First Presbyterian  
9 Church in Colorado Springs, Colorado, to honor and remember  
10 those members of our nation's emergency medical services who  
11 made the ultimate sacrifice and gave their lives in the line of  
12 duty during the past year; and

13 WHEREAS, The sponsors of the event ask for voluntary  
14 participation by all the nation's emergency medical service

1 providers, agencies and emergency communication centers to  
2 observe 60 seconds of radio silence timed to coincide with a  
3 moment of silence observed during the actual service held in  
4 Colorado Springs, Colorado, set for 6:00 p.m. (MDT) on June 26,  
5 2010; and

6 WHEREAS, This year marks the 13th time this shared moment of  
7 silence for emergency medical service members is being observed  
8 across the nation; therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June  
10 26, 2010, as the "Thirteenth Annual National Moment of Silence  
11 Day" in Pennsylvania and urge emergency medical service  
12 providers and agencies throughout this Commonwealth to observe a  
13 special moment of silence in honor of those emergency medical  
14 service personnel who have died in the line of duty.
