A JOINT RESOLUTION

1	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
2	of Pennsylvania, reducing the size of the General Assembly.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby resolves as follows:
5	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
6	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
7	That section 16 of Article II be amended to read:
8	§ 16. Legislative districts.
9	The Commonwealth shall be divided into [50] <u>38</u> senatorial and
10	[203] 153 representative districts, which shall be composed of
11	compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population
12	as practicable. Each senatorial district shall elect one

Senator, and each representative district one Representative.
Unless absolutely necessary no county, city, incorporated town,
borough, township or ward shall be divided in forming either a
senatorial or representative district.

5 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General 6 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 7 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to 8 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 9 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 10 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 11 12 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

13 Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this (b) 14 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 15 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 16 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 17 18 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 19 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 20 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment 21 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 22 23 primary, general or municipal election which meets the 24 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article 25 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least 26 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is 27 passed by the General Assembly.

28 Section 3. Upon ratification by the electors, the General 29 Assembly shall enact legislation to implement this 30 constitutional amendment so that it applies for the first time
