## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to dogs, regulating 2 the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and 3 kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases; 5 regulating the sale and transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal property and the subject of theft; 7 providing for the abandonment of animals; providing for the 8 assessment of damages done to animals; providing for payment 9 of damages by the Commonwealth in certain cases and the 10 liability of the owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; 11 imposing powers and duties on certain State and local 12 13 officers and employees; providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted Account," further providing for 14 15 enforcement of act and inspection. 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 17 hereby enacts as follows: 18 Section 1. Section 901(b.2) of the act of December 7, 1982 19 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, amended October 9, 2008 20 (P.L.1450, No.119), is amended to read: 21 Section 901. Enforcement of this act by the secretary; 22 provisions for inspections. 23 \* \* \*

- 1 (b.2) Limitation on the possession of firearms. -- No dog
- 2 warden or employee of the department shall carry, possess or use
- 3 a firearm in the performance of duties[.] <u>unless the person has</u>
- 4 the approval of the secretary and holds a current and valid
- 5 certification in the use and handling of firearms under any of
- 6 the following:
- 7 (1) 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal
- 8 <u>police education and training).</u>
- 9 (2) The act of October 10, 1974 (P.L.705, No.235), known
- 10 <u>as the "Lethal Weapons Training Act."</u>
- 11 (3) The act of February 9, 1984 (P.L.3, No.2), known as
- 12 <u>the "Deputy Sheriffs' Education and Training Act."</u>
- 13 (4) Any other firearms program which has been determined
- by the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police to be of
- 15 sufficient scope and duration to provide the participant with
- basic training in the use and handling of firearms. The
- 17 department may provide for the firearms training for dog
- wardens.
