AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance,
- 4 providing for the medical assistance transportation program.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Public Welfare Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 9 read:
- 10 Section 443.11. Medical Assistance Transportation Program. --
- 11 (a) The department shall promulgate rules and regulations
- 12 setting eligibility requirements, need verification procedures,
- 13 assistance levels and other requirements necessary to operate
- 14 the medical assistance transportation program in an efficient
- 15 and cost-effective manner.

- 1 (b) The department shall promulgate rules and regulations to
- 2 <u>coordinate the operation and management of the medical</u>
- 3 assistance transportation program through regional or-
- 4 metropolitan offices if such regionalization would result in
- 5 efficiencies or cost reduction.
- 6 (B) The department shall make fully available to all
- 7 MATP offices the Client Information System (CIS) or any
- 8 <u>successor system designed to track and record information</u>
- 9 relating to a recipient's assistance and eligibility.
- 10 (C) Transportation service providers shall record and
- 11 <u>submit to the MATP office the name and address of each passenger</u>
- 12 and the time and location of each pick up and drop off, UNLESS
- 13 THE COLLECTION OF SUCH INFORMATION IS NOT FEASIBLE FOR THE MODE
- 14 OF TRANSPORTATION.
- 15 (e) (D) The department shall develop a standard attestation
- 16 form to be signed by the recipient and the medical services
- 17 provider attesting that the recipient attended the appointment
- 18 or meeting as directed.
- 19 (f) (E) Recipients receiving mileage reimbursement shall
- 20 record the locations of the trip's starting and ending points,
- 21 the vehicle's starting and ending odometer reading for each trip
- 22 direction, the make, model and license plate number of the
- 23 vehicle and the names and addresses of any passengers in the
- 24 <u>vehicle</u> during the trip.
- 25 (a) (F) MATP offices providing transportation services and
- 26 mileage reimbursement through the medical assistance
- 27 transportation program shall satisfy each of the following:
- 28 (1) Transportation services or mileage reimbursement shall
- 29 be preauthorized by the MATP office.
- 30 (2) Transportation services or mileage reimbursement shall

- 1 be authorized only for transportation to medical assistance
- 2 providers.
- 3 (3) The MATP office shall authorize transportation services
- 4 or mileage reimbursement for the least expensive mode of
- 5 transportation that is appropriate for the recipient's medical
- 6 <u>condition and physical capability.</u>
- 7 (4) The MATP office shall authorize transportation services
- 8 for the closest available medical service provider THAT MEETS
- 9 THE RECIPIENT'S MEDICAL NEEDS.
- 10 (5) Mileage reimbursement funds shall not be disbursed to
- 11 the recipient unless the recipient submits documentation
- 12 <u>required under subsection (f) (E) and a completed and signed</u>
- 13 <u>attestation form.</u>
- 14 (6) Transportation services shall not ONLY be authorized
- 15 <u>unless</u> IF the recipient has submitted a completed and signed

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- 16 <u>attestation form for all previous trips OCCURRING MORE THAN</u>
- 17 FIFTEEN DAYS BEFORE THE REQUEST FOR SERVICES.
- 18 (7) Mileage reimbursement shall be calculated as equal to
- 19 <u>the lesser of the distance from the individual's residence to</u>
- 20 THE LESSER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 21 (I) THE DISTANCE FROM THE INDIVIDUAL'S RESIDENCE TO the
- 22 closest available medical services provider or fifty miles. THAT
- 23 MEETS THE RECIPIENT'S MEDICAL NEEDS; OR
- 24 (II) FIFTY MILES, UNLESS THE RECIPIENT IS EXEMPTED BY THE
- 25 DEPARTMENT OR MATP OFFICE FOR MEDICALLY NECESSARY SERVICES IN
- 26 EXCESS OF FIFTY MILES.
- 27 (h) (G) As used in this section, the following words and
- 28 phrases shall have the following meanings:
- 29 "MATP office" means any governmental body or contractor
- 30 providing services under the medical assistance transportation

- 1 program.
- 2 "Medical assistance transportation program" or "MATP" means
- 3 the program funded in part by the Department of Public Welfare
- 4 that provides nonemergency transportation to medical services
- 5 for medical assistance patients who have no other transportation
- 6 available to them.
- 7 "Transportation services" means contracted services provided
- 8 by MATP offices to transport recipients and approved medically
- 9 <u>necessary escorts to medical appointments, including public</u>
- 10 transportation, demand responsive transport, shared ride, formal
- 11 and informal carpooling arrangements and paratransit.
- 12 Section 2. Any regulations inconsistent with the addition of
- 13 section 443.11 of the act are abrogated.
- 14 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. AS
- 15 FOLLOWS:
- 16 (1) THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 17 IMMEDIATELY:
- 18 (I) THIS SECTION.
- 19 (II) THE ADDITION OF SECTION 443.11(A) OF THE ACT.
- 20 (2) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 90
- 21 DAYS.
