## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to elections," in primary and election expenses, further providing for the definition of "expenditure."

16	(P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,

21	(d) The word "expenditure" shall mean:
22	(1) The payment, distribution, loan or advancement of money

or any valuable thing by a candidate, political committee or 1 2 other person for the purpose of influencing the outcome of an 3 election. The payment, distribution, loan or advancement of money or any valuable thing must be made only for legitimate and 4 verifiable campaign expenses and not for any inherently personal 5 purpose. "Inherently personal purpose" means a purpose that, by 6 7 its nature, confers a personal benefit, including a home 8 mortgage, rent, utility payment, clothing purchase, noncampaign automobile expense, country club membership, vacation or a trip 9 10 of a noncampaign nature, household food items, tuition payments, admission to a sporting event, concert, theater or other form of 11 12 entertainment; 13 (2) The payment, distribution, loan, advance or transfer of 14 money or other valuable thing between or among political committees; 15 The providing of a service or other valuable thing for 16 (3) the purpose of influencing the outcome of a nomination or 17 18 election of any person to any public office to be voted for in 19 this Commonwealth; or 20 (4) The payment or providing of money or other valuable thing by any person other than a candidate or political 21 22 committee, to compensate any person for services rendered to a 23 candidate or political committee. \* \* \* 24 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
