## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Amending the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), entitled "An act establishing salaries and compensation of certain public officials including justices and judges of Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas, judges of the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the Philadelphia Traffic Court, district justices and the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor General, the Attorney General and certain other State officers and the salary and certain expenses of the members of the General Assembly; and repealing certain inconsistent acts," further providing for compensation of members of the General Assembly.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. Section 4 of the act of September 30, 1983
16	(P.L.160, No.39), known as the Public Official Compensation Law,
17	is amended by adding a subsection to read:
18	Section 4. Members of the General Assembly.

20	(e) Health care coverage contributionMembers of the
21	General Assembly shall contribute to the cost of their health
22	insurance plan. The amount of the contribution shall be

1	calculated annually and collected as a monthly payroll
2	deduction. The annual rate of contribution shall be a percentage
3	of the annual cost of the member's health insurance plan premium
4	and shall be as follows:
5	(1) Beginning January 1, 2012, through December 31,
6	2012, members shall annually contribute 5% of the premium.
7	(2) Beginning January 1, 2013, through December 31,
8	2014, members shall annually contribute 8% of the premium.
9	(3) Beginning January 1, 2015, through December 31,
10	2016, members shall annually contribute 11% of the premium.
11	(4) Beginning January 1, 2017, through December 31,
12	2018, members shall annually contribute 14% of the premium.
13	(5) Beginning January 1, 2019, through December 31,
14	2020, members shall annually contribute 17% of the premium.
15	(6) Beginning January 1, 2021, and for each year
16	thereafter, members shall annually contribute 20% of the
17	premium.
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
