AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, further providing for width of vehicles.

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4 hereby enacts as follows:

7 SECTION 1. SECTION 4921(B) INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH, (1) AND ←
8 (5) OF TITLE 75 OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES ARE
9 AMENDED AND THE SUBSECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING A PARAGRAPH TO
10 READ:

11 § 4921. Width of vehicles.

13 (b) Special vehicles.--THE FOLLOWING PARAGRAPHS DETERMINE ←
14 WIDTHS FOR SPECIAL VEHICLES, WITH EACH PARAGRAPH SPECIFICALLY

CONTROLLING ITS OWN SUBJECT MATTER IN THE EVENT OF A CONFLICT
WITH ANOTHER PARAGRAPH:

(1) Any implement of husbandry or vehicle loaded with [vegetable produce or forage] crops or nutrients and not exceeding [11] 12 feet in width may be driven, hauled or towed between sunrise and sunset on highways other than freeways.

~~(2) Any implement of husbandry not exceeding 14 feet 6 inches in width may be driven, hauled or towed between sunrise and sunset on highways other than freeways:~~ ←

~~(i) Between parts of one farm owned or operated by the owner of the implement of husbandry.~~

~~(ii) Between farms owned or operated by the owner of the implement of husbandry located not more than 50 miles apart.~~

~~(iii) Between:~~

~~(A) farms; or~~

~~(B) a farm owned or operated by a farmer and a place of business of a mechanic or dealer in implements of husbandry;~~

~~located not more than 150 miles away for the purpose of buying, selling, trading, loaning and leasing, demonstrating, repairing or servicing the implement of husbandry.~~

~~(3) Special mobile equipment not exceeding nine feet two inches in width may be driven, hauled or towed between sunrise and sunset on highways other than freeways.~~

~~(4) The department may regulate the operation of special vehicles subject to this subsection which regulations may prohibit the operation of special vehicles on certain days or~~

3 (5) An implement of husbandry or vehicle used
4 [exclusively for highly perishable crops for processing] for
5 crops or nutrients and not exceeding 14 feet 6 inches in
6 width may be operated on highways other than freeways between
7 ~~sunset and sunrise [only during the period of May 20 to~~
8 ~~October 15]. The implement or vehicle, when used at this~~
9 ~~time, shall have two rotating yellow beacons and vehicular~~
10 ~~hazard signal lamps operating.~~

11 ~~(6) Commercial implements of husbandry not exceeding 12-~~
12 ~~feet in width, including wheels and tires, may be driven,~~
13 ~~hailed or towed between sunrise and sunset on highways other~~
14 ~~than freeways. SUNSET AND SUNRISE [ONLY DURING THE PERIOD OF~~
15 ~~MAY 20 TO OCTOBER 15]. THE IMPLEMENT OR VEHICLE, WHEN USED AT~~
16 ~~THIS TIME, SHALL HAVE [TWO ROTATING YELLOW BEACONS] AND~~
17 ~~[VEHICULAR] OPERATE AT LEAST ONE FLASHING OR REVOLVING YELLOW~~
18 ~~LIGHT OR STROBE LIGHT, WHICH SHALL BE MOUNTED TO PROVIDE~~
19 ~~VISIBILITY TO VEHICLES APPROACHING FROM ANY DIRECTION, 360-~~
20 ~~DEGREE VISIBILITY, REGARDLESS OF THE METHOD OF MOUNTING, AND~~
21 ~~HAZARD [SIGNAL LAMPS OPERATING] SIGNALS.~~

23 (7) As used in this section, the following words and
24 phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
25 subsection:

26 "Crop." The term includes, but is not limited to:

27 (i) Field crops, including corn, wheat, oats, rye,
28 barley, hay, potatoes and dry beans.

29 (ii) Fruits, including apples, peaches, grapes,
30 cherries and berries.

1 (iii) Vegetables, including tomatoes, snap beans,
2 cabbage, carrots, beets, onions and mushrooms.

3 "Nutrient." The term includes, but is not limited to:

4 (i) A substance or recognized plant nutrient,
5 element or compound that is used or sold for its plant
6 nutritive content or its claimed nutritive value.

7 (ii) Livestock and poultry manures and their
8 byproducts, compost used as fertilizer, commercially
9 manufactured chemical fertilizers, biosolids or
10 combinations of commercially manufactured chemical
11 biosolids.
