## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the dedication and fortitude of the emergency 1 2
  - response community in Pennsylvania who worked tirelessly
- during the preparation and recovery periods of Hurricane
- Irene and Tropical Storm Lee.
- 5 WHEREAS, On the days of August 27 and 28, 2011, Pennsylvania
- witnessed one of Mother Nature's most destructive weather events
- as Hurricane Irene pounded this Commonwealth as a Category 1
- 8 hurricane; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The winds of Hurricane Irene, combined with
- 10 saturated grounds due to heavy rain, contributed to flooding,
- 11 structural damages, downed power lines and many uprooted trees
- 12 across this Commonwealth; and
- 13 WHEREAS, As the ninth named storm and first major hurricane
- 14 of the 2011 Atlantic hurricane season, Hurricane Irene was

- 1 responsible for at least 45 deaths in the eastern United States;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, According to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management
- 4 Agency (PEMA), Hurricane Irene was associated with five deaths
- 5 and more than 760,000 people without power across this
- 6 Commonwealth, leading 13 counties to declare states of
- 7 emergency; and
- 8 WHEREAS, During the days of September 6 through 10, 2011,
- 9 Pennsylvania endured yet another catastrophic weather event as
- 10 heavy rainfall from Tropical Storm Lee stalled over central and
- 11 eastern portions of this State, held in place by Hurricane Katia
- 12 off the mid-Atlantic coast; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Additional heavy rainfall from Tropical Storm Lee,
- 14 combined with already saturated grounds from Hurricane Irene,
- 15 created one of the most devastating flooding events in central
- 16 and eastern Pennsylvania, with many areas experiencing flood
- 17 levels close to or exceeding the historic levels caused by
- 18 Hurricane Agnes in late June of 1972; and
- 19 WHEREAS, As the 12th named storm of the 2011 Atlantic
- 20 hurricane season, Tropical Storm Lee caused widespread damage
- 21 and devastation to parts of this Commonwealth already reeling
- 22 from the effects of Hurricane Irene; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The State Emergency Operations Center, operating at
- 24 elevated levels every day since August 25 during the preparation
- 25 and recovery periods of both Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm
- 26 Lee, witnessed its first Level 1 status since September 11,
- 27 2001; and
- 28 WHEREAS, According to PEMA, 13 counties received Federal
- 29 emergency declarations for Hurricane Irene and 42 counties
- 30 received Federal emergency declarations for Tropical Storm Lee;

- 1 and
- WHEREAS, PEMA also reports that to date, more than \$61
- 3 million in funds have been approved for individual assistance
- 4 and 20 Disaster Recovery Centers have opened throughout this
- 5 Commonwealth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is
- 7 supplying temporary housing units to address the shortage of
- 8 short-term housing available in the northern tier counties; and
- 9 WHEREAS, As efforts are made to assist the Commonwealth in
- 10 the recovery from Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee, total
- 11 damage amounts and reports are still being compiled; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Preparation and recovery during widespread
- 13 emergencies such as Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee
- 14 involve collaboration among the community, private industry and
- 15 various governmental and nongovernmental agencies; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Fire departments, law enforcement agencies, utility
- 17 companies and the Pennsylvania National Guard united together to
- 18 assist affected Commonwealth citizens in the preparation and
- 19 recovery periods of Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Various agencies within the emergency response
- 21 community in this Commonwealth continue to be committed to
- 22 helping all residents, communities and businesses in the
- 23 preparation for and recovery from any and all emergencies,
- 24 including Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The determination and fortitude of the thousands of
- 26 men and women who worked tirelessly during the preparation for
- 27 and the aftermath of Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee
- 28 further prove the bravery and dedication of Pennsylvania's
- 29 emergency response community during difficult times; therefore
- 30 be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives continue to
- 2 support the various emergency response agencies in this
- 3 Commonwealth in the preparation for and recovery from
- 4 emergencies that will test the safety and security of this
- 5 Commonwealth; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives applaud the
- 7 efforts of the men and women within Pennsylvania's emergency
- 8 response community who continue to keep this Commonwealth safe
- 9 and prepared for any and all emergencies.
