1 2 3	Honoring the life of Joseph "Butter" Tamburro, WDAS radio personality, civil rights leader, and Philadelphia icon, and extending condolences to his family.
4	WHEREAS, Joseph "Butter" Tamburro, a husband, father,
5	grandfather, friend and icon, passed away on July 27, 2012, at
6	70 years of age; and
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Tamburro, an Italian American from South
8	Philadelphia, was born in 1942, and he was an avid radio
9	listener and admirer of rhythm and blues; and
10	WHEREAS, Mr. Tamburro began his career as an advertising
11	salesman with WDAS radio in 1964 after a brief career as an auto
12	mechanic; and
13	WHEREAS, Mr. Tamburro was given the nickname "Butterball" by
14	WDAS Program Director Jimmy Bishop, but would become more
15	commonly known as "Butter"; and
16	WHEREAS, As an avid radio listener and admirer of rhythm and

blues, "Butter" would quickly realize his dream and become a
part-time disc jockey at WDAS, and he began hosting the first
oldies show on African-American radio; and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Tamburro was the Program Director at WDAS for 5 more than 30 years and hosted his famous dance parties at 6 various venues in Philadelphia; and

7 WHEREAS, Throughout Mr. Tamburro's career, he received 8 several awards and honors from entities such as the March of Dimes, the Philadelphia Music Alliance, the National Association 9 10 for the Advancement of Colored People, the Black Music Association and trade publications such as R&R, Billboard 11 12 Monitor, Black Radio Exclusive and Gavin Magazine; and 13 WHEREAS, Mr. Tamburro was also renowned for his involvement 14 in the Civil Rights Movement, specifically in spreading the 15 message of equality by offering the airwaves to civil rights 16 leaders such as the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. and Attorney Cecil B. Moore; therefore be it 17

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives express its sadness upon the passing of Joseph "Butter" Tamburro and offer its most sincere condolences to his family and friends; and be it further
