#### AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for adjustments based on Consumer Price Index; and further providing for work to be done under contract let on bids and exception, for purchase of supplies, for contracts for construction, repair, renovation or maintenance, for project contracts and for powers and duties of institution presidents.
11	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
12	hereby enacts as follows:
13	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
14	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
15	section to read:
16	Section 118. Adjustments Based on Consumer Price Index. (a)
17	(1) Every five years, beginning with the year in which this
18	subsection becomes applicable to contracts and purchases, the
19	<u>Department of Labor and Industry shall calculate the average</u>
20	percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban

1	<u>Consumers (CPI-U) for the United States city average for all</u>
2	items as published by the United States Department of Labor,
3	Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the preceding five-year period.
4	(2) The amounts at which competitive bidding or written or
5	telephonic price quotations are required under this act shall be
6	adjusted every five years as follows:
7	(i) In the case of competitive bidding, the positive
8	percentage change, as determined in accordance with clause (1),
9	shall be multiplied by the amount applicable under the provision
10	requiring competitive bidding for the current five year period
11	and the product thereof shall be added to the amount applicable
12	under the provision requiring competitive bidding for the
13	current five-year period, with the result rounded to the nearest
14	<u>multiple of one hundred dollars (\$100).</u>
15	(ii) In the case of written or telephonic price quotations,
16	the positive percentage change, as determined in accordance with
17	clause (1), shall be multiplied by the amount applicable under
18	the provision requiring written or telephonic price quotations
19	for the current five-year period and the product thereof shall
20	be added to the amount applicable under the provision requiring
21	written or telephonic price quotations for the current five-year-
22	period, with the result rounded to the nearest multiple of one
23	<u>hundred dollars (\$100).</u>
24	(3) The determination required under clause (1) and the
25	calculation of the adjustments required under clause (2) shall
26	be made in the period between October 1 and November 15 of the
27	year following the effective date of this subsection, and
28	between October 1 and November 15 of each successive year.
29	(4) The adjusted amounts obtained in accordance with clause
30	(2) shall become effective January 1 for the five year period

1	following the year in which the determination required under
2	<u>clause (1) is made.</u>
3	(5) The Department of Labor and Industry shall give notice
4	<u>in the Pennsylvania Bulletin prior to January 1 of each calendar</u>
5	year in which the percentage change is determined in accordance
6	with clause (1) of the amounts, whether adjusted or unadjusted
7	in accordance with clause (2), at which competitive bidding or
8	written or telephonic price quotations are required for the
9	five-year period beginning the first day of January after
10	publication of the notice.
11	SECTION 119. ADJUSTMENTS BASED ON CONSUMER PRICE INDEX
12	ADJUSTMENTS TO THE BASE AMOUNTS SHALL BE MADE AS FOLLOWS:
13	(1) THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY SHALL DETERMINE THE
14	PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE ALL ITEMS CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR ALL
15	URBAN CONSUMERS (CPI-U) FOR THE UNITED STATES CITY AVERAGE AS
16	PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF
17	LABOR STATISTICS, FOR THE TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER
18	30, 2012, AND FOR EACH SUCCESSIVE TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD
19	THEREAFTER.
20	(2) IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT THERE IS NO POSITIVE
21	PERCENTAGE CHANGE, THEN NO ADJUSTMENT TO THE BASE AMOUNTS SHALL
22	OCCUR FOR THE RELEVANT TIME PERIOD.
23	(3) (I) IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT THERE IS A
24	POSITIVE PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE FIRST YEAR THAT THE
25	DETERMINATION IS MADE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1), THE POSITIVE
26	PERCENTAGE CHANGE SHALL BE MULTIPLIED BY EACH BASE AMOUNT AND
27	THE PRODUCTS SHALL BE ADDED TO THE BASE AMOUNTS, RESPECTIVELY,
28	AND THE SUMS SHALL BE PRELIMINARY ADJUSTED AMOUNTS.
29	(II) THE PRELIMINARY ADJUSTED AMOUNTS SHALL BE ROUNDED TO
30	THE NEAREST ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000), TO DETERMINE THE

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1 FINAL ADJUSTED BASE AMOUNTS.

2 (4) IN EACH SUCCESSIVE YEAR IN WHICH THERE IS A POSITIVE 3 PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE CPI-U FOR THE UNITED STATES CITY 4 AVERAGE, THE POSITIVE PERCENTAGE CHANGE SHALL BE MULTIPLIED BY THE MOST RECENT PRELIMINARY ADJUSTED AMOUNTS AND THE PRODUCTS 5 6 SHALL BE ADDED TO THE PRELIMINARY ADJUSTED AMOUNT OF THE PRIOR 7 YEAR TO CALCULATE THE PRELIMINARY ADJUSTED AMOUNTS FOR THE 8 CURRENT YEAR. THE SUMS THEREOF SHALL BE ROUNDED TO THE NEAREST 9 ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000) TO DETERMINE THE NEW FINAL 10 ADJUSTED BASE AMOUNTS. 11 (5) THE DETERMINATIONS AND ADJUSTMENTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS 12 SECTION SHALL BE MADE IN THE PERIOD BETWEEN OCTOBER 1 AND 13 NOVEMBER 15 OF THE YEAR FOLLOWING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, AND ANNUALLY BETWEEN OCTOBER 1 AND NOVEMBER 15 OF EACH 14 15 YEAR THEREAFTER. 16 (6) THE FINAL ADJUSTED BASE AMOUNTS AND NEW FINAL ADJUSTED 17 BASE AMOUNTS OBTAINED UNDER PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) SHALL BECOME 18 EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1 FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR FOLLOWING THE YEAR IN 19 WHICH THE DETERMINATION REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) IS MADE. 20 (7) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH NOTICE IN THE PENNSYLVANIA 21 BULLETIN PRIOR TO JANUARY 1 OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR OF THE ANNUAL 22 PERCENTAGE CHANGE DETERMINED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) AND THE 23 UNADJUSTED OR FINAL ADJUSTED BASE AMOUNTS DETERMINED UNDER 24 PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) AT WHICH COMPETITIVE BIDDING IS REQUIRED AND WRITTEN OR TELEPHONIC PRICE QUOTATIONS ARE REQUIRED, 25 RESPECTIVELY, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING THE FIRST DAY OF 26 27 JANUARY AFTER PUBLICATION OF THE NOTICE. THE NOTICE SHALL 28 INCLUDE A WRITTEN AND ILLUSTRATIVE EXPLANATION OF THE 29 CALCULATIONS PERFORMED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN ESTABLISHING THE 30 UNADJUSTED OR FINAL ADJUSTED BASE AMOUNTS UNDER THIS SECTION FOR

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#### 1 THE ENSUING CALENDAR YEAR.

### 2 (8) NO ADJUSTMENT TO THE BASE AMOUNTS SHALL EXCEED THREE 3 PERCENT OF THE MOST RECENTLY ADJUSTED BASE AMOUNT. Section 2. Sections 751(a), (a.1), (b) and (f) and 807.1 of 4 the act, amended or added May 4, 1990 (P.L.164, No.38), are 5 6 amended to read: 7 Section 751. Work to be Done Under Contract Let on Bids; 8 Exception. -- (a) All construction, reconstruction, repairs, maintenance or work of any nature, including the introduction of 9 10 plumbing, heating and ventilating, or lighting systems, upon any 11 school building or upon any school property, or upon any 12 building or portion of a building leased under the provisions of 13 section 703.1, made by any school district, where the entire 14 cost, value, or amount of such construction, reconstruction, 15 repairs, maintenance or work, including labor and material, 16 shall exceed [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)] twenty-five\_ thousand dollars (\$25,000) A BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND 17 18 FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to adjustment under\_ 19 section 118 119, shall be done under separate contracts to be 20 entered into by such school district with the lowest responsible bidder, upon proper terms, after due public notice has been 21 given asking for competitive bids. Whenever a board of school 22 23 directors shall approve the use of a prefabricated unit,

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24 complete in itself, for a school building or other proper 25 structure to be erected upon school property, the board of 26 school directors may have prepared appropriate specifications detailing the size and material desired in a particular 27 28 prefabricated unit, including all utilities such as plumbing, 29 heating and ventilating, and electrical work, and may advertise 30 for a single bid on all the work and award the contract therefor

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to the lowest responsible bidder: Provided, That if due to an 1 2 emergency a school plant or any part thereof becomes unusable 3 competitive bids for repairs or replacement may be solicited from at least three responsible bidders, and upon the approval 4 5 of any of these bids by the Secretary of Education, the board of school directors may proceed at once to make the necessary 6 7 repairs or replacements in accordance with the terms of said 8 approved bid or bids.

9 (a.1) Written or telephonic price quotations from at least 10 three qualified and responsible contractors shall be requested by the board of school directors for all contracts that exceed 11 [four thousand dollars (\$4,000)] seven thousand dollars (\$7,000) 12 13 A BASE AMOUNT OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000), subject to 14 adjustment under section 118 119, but are less than the amount 15 requiring advertisement and competitive bidding, or, in lieu of 16 price quotations, a memorandum shall be kept on file showing that fewer than three qualified contractors exist in the market 17 18 area within which it is practicable to obtain quotations. A 19 written record of telephonic price quotations shall be made and 20 shall contain at least the date of the quotation, the name of the contractor and the contractor's representative, the 21 construction, reconstruction, repair, maintenance or work which 22 23 was the subject of the quotation and the price. Written price 24 quotations, written records of telephonic price quotations and 25 memoranda shall be retained for a period of three years. 26 The board of school directors in any school district may (b) perform any construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work of 27 28 any nature, where the entire cost or value, including labor and

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29 material, is less than [five thousand dollars (\$5000)] <u>seven</u>
30 <u>thousand dollars (\$7,000)</u> A BASE AMOUNT OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS

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(\$10,000), subject to adjustment under section 118 119, by its 1 2 own maintenance personnel. The board of school directors in any 3 school district may authorize the secretary of the board or other executive to award contracts for construction, 4 reconstruction, repairs, or work of any nature, where the entire 5 cost or value, including labor and material, [is ten thousand 6 dollars (\$10,000)] subject to adjustment under section 118 119, 7 8 is twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) A BASE AMOUNT OF 9 EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500) or less, 10 without soliciting competitive bids, subject, however, to the provisions of subsection (a.1). 11

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13 (f) No board of school directors shall evade the provisions of this section as to advertising for bids or purchasing 14 15 materials or contracting for services piecemeal for the purpose of obtaining prices under [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)] 16 twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) A BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN 17 ← 18 THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to adjustment\_ 19 under section 118 119, upon transactions which should, in the ← 20 exercise of reasonable discretion and prudence, be conducted as 21 one transaction amounting to more than [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)] twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) A BASE AMOUNT\_ 22 ← 23 OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to 24 adjustment under section 118 119. This provision is intended to ← 25 make unlawful the practice of evading advertising requirements by making a series of purchases or contracts each for less than 26 the advertising requirement price, or by making several 27 28 simultaneous purchases or contracts each below said price, when 29 in either case the transaction involved should have been made as 30 one transaction for one price.

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1 Section 807.1. Purchase of Supplies.--(a) All furniture, 2 equipment, textbooks, school supplies and other appliances for 3 the use of the public schools, costing [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)], subject to adjustment under section 118, twenty five-4 ← thousand dollars (\$25,000) 119, A BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN 5 ← THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500) or more shall be 6 7 purchased by the board of school directors only after due 8 advertisement as hereinafter provided. Supplies, subject to adjustment under section 118, costing [ten thousand dollars-9 10 (\$10,000)] twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) SUPPLIES 4 11 COSTING [TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000)], SUBJECT TO ADJUSTMENT 12 UNDER SECTION 119, A BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE 13 HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500) or more shall be purchased by the 14 board of school directors only after public notice has been 15 given by advertisement once a week for three (3) weeks in not 16 less than two (2) newspapers of general circulation. In any district where no newspaper is published, said notice may, in 17 18 lieu of such publication, be posted in at least five (5) public 19 places.

20 Written or telephonic price quotations from at least (a.1) 21 three qualified and responsible vendors shall be requested by the board of school directors for all purchases of supplies that 22 23 exceed [four thousand dollars (\$4,000)] seven thousand dollars\_ 24 (\$7,000) A BASE AMOUNT OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000), subject to adjustment under section 118 119, but are less than 25 26 the amount requiring advertisement and competitive bidding, or, 27 in lieu of price quotations, a memorandum shall be kept on file 28 showing that fewer than three qualified vendors exist in the 29 market area within which it is practicable to obtain quotations. 30 A written record of telephonic price quotations shall be made

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1 and shall contain at least the date of the quotation, the name 2 of the vendor and the vendor's representative, the supplies 3 which were the subject of the quotation and the price of the 4 supplies. Written price quotations, written records of 5 telephonic price quotations and memoranda shall be retained for 6 a period of three years.

7 The board of school directors shall accept the bid of (b) 8 the lowest responsible bidder, kind, quality, and material being 9 equal, but shall have the right to reject any and all bids, or 10 select a single item from any bid. The board of school directors in any district may authorize or appoint the secretary of the 11 board or other executive as purchasing agent for the district, 12 with authority to purchase supplies [costing] THAT COST A BASE 13 ← 14 AMOUNT OF less than [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)] twenty-five\_ ← thousand dollars (\$25,000) EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED 15 4 16 DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to adjustment under section 118 119. 4 The following shall be exempt from the above provisions: 17 (C) 18 maps, music, globes, charts, educational films, filmstrips, 19 prepared transparencies and slides, pre-recorded magnetic tapes

20 and disc recordings, textbooks, games, toys, prepared kits, 21 flannel board materials, flash cards, models, projectuals and 22 teacher demonstration devices necessary for school use.

23 (d) No board of school directors shall evade the provisions 24 of this section as to advertising for bids or purchasing 25 materials piecemeal for the purpose of obtaining prices under [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)] <u>twenty five thousand dollars</u> 26 (\$25,000) THE BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED 27 28 DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to adjustment under section 118 119, 29 upon transactions which should, in the exercise of reasonable discretion and prudence, be conducted as one transaction 30

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amounting to more than [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)] twenty-1 five thousand dollars (\$25,000) A BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN 2 THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to adjustment 3 under section 118 119. This provision is intended to make 4 unlawful the practice of evading advertising requirements by 5 6 making a series of purchases or contracts each for less than the advertising requirement price, or by making several simultaneous 7 8 purchases or contracts each below said price, when in either case the transaction involved should have been made as one 9 10 transaction for one price.

(relating to procurement)] 19 twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) A BASE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$18,500), subject to adjustment 20 under section 118 119, shall be advertised in the manner 21 provided by law and competitively bid and awarded to the lowest 22 23 responsible bidder. In case of emergencies and notwithstanding 24 any other provision of this section to the contrary, the board 25 of trustees may make or authorize others to make an emergency 26 procurement whenever a threat exists to public health, welfare 27 or safety or circumstances outside the control of the college 28 and creates an urgency of need which does not permit the delay 29 involved in using more formal competitive methods. 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1 SECTION 4.1. SECTION 2010-A OF THE ACT, AMENDED APRIL 27,

2 1998 (P.L.270, NO.46), IS AMENDED TO READ:

Section 2010-A. Power and Duties of Institution 3 Presidents. -- The president of each institution shall be 4 5 appointed by the board. The president shall be the chief executive officer of that institution. He shall have the right 6 7 to attend all meetings of the council of that institution and 8 shall have the right to speak on all matters before the council 9 but not to vote. Subject to the stated authority of the board 10 and the council, each president shall have the following powers 11 and duties:
