## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue 2 subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing 3 for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and 4 Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 5 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 6 7 further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," providing for criminal history record 8 information. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. The act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), 13 entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee 14 to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; 15 providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional 16 and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 17 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 18 further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," 19 is amended by adding a section to read: 20 Section 5.2. Criminal history record information.
- 21 The Bureau of Enforcement and Investigation, licensing boards

- 1 and commissions under the Bureau of Professional and
- 2 Occupational Affairs and the Prosecution Division of the Legal
- 3 Office in the Department of State shall have the specific power
- 4 and duty, for purposes of licensing and enforcement, to receive
- 5 <u>information otherwise protected by 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 91 (relating</u>
- 6 to criminal history record information). This information shall
- 7 be protected from dissemination as if the Bureau of Enforcement
- 8 and Investigation, the licensing boards or commissions and the
- 9 Prosecution Division of the Department of State were a criminal
- 10 justice agency as defined under 18 Pa.C.S. § 9102 (relating to
- 11 <u>definitions</u>) of the Criminal History Record Information Act. The
- 12 Bureau of Enforcement and Investigation, licensing boards and
- 13 commissions and Prosecution Division of the Department of State
- 14 may consider this information in determining whether to grant,
- 15 renew, suspend or revoke any license, certificate, registration
- 16 or permit.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
