## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 2 Executive and Judicial Departments and the State Government Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of billsincurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Revenue Account, the Hazardous Material Response 10 Fund, The State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the 11 12 Home Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 13 Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking and Securities Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, 14 the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, the 15 Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account and the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, to the Executive Department; to provide 18 appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation 19 Account to the Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 20 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013; to provide appropriations from the 21 22 Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2012, to June-23 30, 2013, for the proper operation of several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized 24 to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the 25 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 26 27 the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012; 28 and to provide for the additional appropriation of Federal 29 and State funds from the General Fund for the Executive and 30 Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal 31 32 year July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, and for the payment of 33 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the
