1 2 3	Amending Title 12 (Commerce and Trade) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, prohibiting the sale of shark fins; and imposing a penalty.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 12 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

15	<u>§ 5501. Definitions.</u>
16	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
17	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
18	context clearly indicates otherwise:

1	"Shark fin." The raw, dried or otherwise processed detached
2	fin or the raw, dried or otherwise processed detached tail of an
3	elasmobranch. The term does not include a drug approved by the
4	Food and Drug Administration of the Department of Health and
5	Human Services of the United States.
6	<u>§ 5502. Prohibition.</u>
7	(a) ProhibitionExcept as provided in subsection (b), a
8	person may not possess, sell, offer for sale, trade or
9	<u>distribute a shark fin.</u>
10	(b) Exceptions
11	(1) Possession of a shark fin is permissible if:
12	(i) the shark was landed under a license from
13	another state; and
14	(ii) it is being possessed in this Commonwealth for
15	taxidermy.
16	(2) Before September 1, 2013, a restaurant may possess,
17	sell, offer for sale, trade or distribute shark fin that:
18	(i) is prepared for consumption; and
19	(ii) the restaurant possesses prior to September 2,
20	<u>2012.</u>
21	<u>§ 5503. Penalty.</u>
22	<u>A person who violates section 5502 (relating to prohibition)</u>
23	commits a misdemeanor of the third degree. Each shark fin
24	possessed, sold, offered for sale or purchased in violation of
25	<u>section 5502 is a separate offense.</u>
26	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
