P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of unemployment compensation to be administered by the 3 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay 7 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the 8 payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; 9 providing procedure and administrative details for the 10 determination, payment and collection of such contributions 11 and the payment of such compensation; providing for 12 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; 13 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State 14 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," further providing for 15 QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED TO SECURE COMPENSATION AND FOR 16 ineligibility for compensation. 17 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows: 20 Section 1. Section 402 of the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd <--21 Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment 22 Compensation Law, is amended by adding a subsection to read: 23 SECTION 1. - 8 (F) HAS EARNED, SUBSEQUENT TO HIS SEPARATION FROM WORK UNDER
- 9 CIRCUMSTANCES WHICH ARE DISQUALIFYING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF
- 10 SUBSECTIONS 402(B), 402(E), 402(E.1) [AND 402(H)], 402(H) AND
- 11 $\underline{402}$ (K) OF THIS ACT, REMUNERATION FOR SERVICES IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL
- 12 TO OR IN EXCESS OF SIX (6) TIMES HIS WEEKLY BENEFIT RATE IN
- 13 "EMPLOYMENT" AS DEFINED IN THIS ACT. THE PROVISIONS OF THIS

- 22 Section 402. Ineligibility for Compensation. -- An employe
- 23 shall be ineligible for compensation for any week--

- 25 (k) In which his unemployment is due to either of the
- 26 following reasons:
- 27 (1) voluntarily leaving employment in order to maintain
- 28 benefits under a retirement plan, annuity or other similar
- 29 periodic payment plan after returning to work following
- 30 retirement; or

- 1 (2) termination of employment in order to maintain benefits
- 2 under a retirement plan, annuity or other similar periodic
- 3 payment plan after returning to work following retirement THE <--
- 4 EMPLOYE'S UNEMPLOYMENT IS DUE TO A SEPARATION FROM WORK
- 5 INITIATED BY THE EMPLOYE OR THE EMPLOYER IN ORDER TO PRESERVE
- 6 THE EMPLOYE'S EXISTING ENTITLEMENT TO A PENSION, INCLUDING A
- 7 GOVERNMENTAL OR OTHER PENSION, RETIREMENT OR RETIRED PAY,
- 8 ANNUITY OR ANY OTHER SIMILAR PERIODIC PAYMENTS.
