AN ACT

- Designating a bridge that carries State Route 153 over the 2 Bennett Branch in Huston Township, Clearfield County, as the Huston Township Veterans Memorial Bridge; and designating U.S. Route 219 in Johnsonburg Borough, Elk County, from the intersection of State Route 1009, Center Street, starting at 5 roadway segment 0502 offset 0000 to the intersection of State 6 7 Route 1009, Center Street, ending at roadway segment 0522 offset 1159, as the Veterans of Johnsonburg Bypass-; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 1001 BETWEEN 9 RHAWN STREET, 0100/0000 AND KENDRICK STREET, 0100/2784 IN THE 10 CITY OF PHILADELPHIA, PHILADELPHIA COUNTY, AS THE FIREFIGHTER 11 DANIEL SWEENEY MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF 12 PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 611 BETWEEN MAPLE AVENUE AND MEETINGHOUSE 13 ROAD, IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, AS THE LIEUTENANT JOSEPH C. PARK 14 II MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 272 15 IN LANCASTER COUNTY, SOUTH OF STATE ROUTE 372 AND BEFORE 16 OSCEOLA ROAD, AS THE STAFF SERGEANT KEITH A. BENNETT HIGHWAY; 17 AND DESIGNATING A PORTION OF U.S. ROUTE 1, CITY AVENUE IN 18 PHILADELPHIA AND MONTGOMERY COUNTIES FROM ITS INTERSECTION 19 WITH PRESIDENTIAL BOULEVARD TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH MONUMENT 20 ROAD AS ED BRADLEY WAY. 21
- 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 23 hereby enacts as follows:
- 24 Section 1. Huston Township Veterans Memorial Bridge.

- 1 (a) Findings.--
- 2 (1) Huston Township, Clearfield County, has been home to
- 3 many valiant military veterans who have given their lives in
- 4 defense of the United States.
- 5 (2) The elected Board of Supervisors of Huston Township
- 6 has endorsed designating this bridge in honor of those
- 7 township residents who have made the ultimate sacrifice for
- 8 our nation over the years.
- 9 (b) Designation.--The bridge that carries State Route 153
- 10 over the Bennett Branch in Huston Township, Clearfield County,
- 11 is hereby designated as the Huston Township Veterans Memorial
- 12 Bridge.
- 13 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 14 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 15 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 16 Section 2. Veterans of Johnsonburg Bypass.
- 17 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares that
- 18 the Borough of Johnsonburg has been home through the years to
- 19 veterans, both living and deceased, who have served our nation
- 20 valiantly.
- 21 (b) Designation.--U.S. Route 219 in Johnsonburg Borough, Elk
- 22 County, from the intersection of State Route 1009, Center
- 23 Street, starting at roadway segment 0502 offset 0000 to the
- 24 intersection of State Route 1009, Center Street, ending at
- 25 roadway segment 0522 offset 1159, is hereby designated as the
- 26 Veterans of Johnsonburg Bypass.
- 27 (c) Signs. -- The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 28 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
- 29 traffic in both directions.
- 30 SECTION 3. FIREFIGHTER DANIEL SWEENEY MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

- 1 (A) FINDINGS. -- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:
- 2 (1) FIREFIGHTER DANIEL SWEENEY WAS A MEMBER OF LADDER 10
- 3 FIRE COMPANY AND RESIDED AT TABOR AND FULLER IN THE HEART OF
- 4 FOX CHASE IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD WHERE HIS PARENTS RESIDE.
- 5 (2) MR. SWEENEY MADE THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE ON MONDAY,
- 6 APRIL 9, 2012, WHILE FIGHTING A FIVE-ALARM FIRE IN
- 7 KENSINGTON. IN THE FIRE, HE LOST HIS LIFE AS A RESULT OF A
- 8 COLLAPSING WALL AND ROOF. HE DEMONSTRATED TRUE COURAGE AND
- 9 HEROISM WHILE IN THE LINE OF DUTY.
- 10 (3) MR. SWEENEY IS SURVIVED BY HIS FATHER, DAVID, WHO IS
- 11 A RETIRED FIRE CAPTAIN, HIS MOTHER, MARIAN, HIS THREE
- 12 SISTERS, SUZANNE SWEDLIGE, SARAH SWEENEY AND DEBORAH SWEENEY,
- 13 HIS BROTHER-IN-LAW, DAVID SWEDLIGE AND HIS NIECE AND
- 14 GODCHILD, STACEY SWEDLIGE.
- 15 (B) DESIGNATION. -- THE SECTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 1001
- 16 BETWEEN RHAWN STREET, 0100/0000 AND KENDRICK STREET, 0100/2784
- 17 IN THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA, PHILADELPHIA COUNTY, IS HEREBY
- 18 DESIGNATED THE FIREFIGHTER DANIEL SWEENEY MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 19 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 20 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 21 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 22 SECTION 4. LIEUTENANT JOSEPH C. PARK II MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 23 (A) FINDINGS.--
- 24 (1) LT. PARK WAS BORN AUGUST 31, 1946, AND LIVED IN
- 25 HORSHAM, PENNSYLVANIA.
- 26 (2) LT. PARK ATTENDED HATBORO-HORSHAM HIGH SCHOOL AND
- 27 VALLEY FORGE MILITARY ACADEMY BEFORE BRIEFLY ATTENDING THE
- 28 PENNSYLVANIA STATE UNIVERSITY.
- 29 (3) LT. PARK WAS A MEMBER OF THE POLO TEAM AT THE VALLEY
- 30 FORGE MILITARY ACADEMY AND ATTAINED THE RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT.

- 1 (4) LT. PARK PROUDLY AND COURAGEOUSLY SERVED IN THE
- 2 UNITED STATES ARMY DURING THE VIETNAM WAR.
- 3 (5) LT. PARK WAS KILLED IN VIETNAM ON MARCH 28, 1968,
- 4 FROM A HOSTILE GUNSHOT WOUND.
- 5 (6) LT. PARK WAS AWARDED THE PURPLE HEART, NATIONAL
- 6 DEFENSE MEDAL, AND REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM SERVICE MEDAL FOR HIS
- 7 MILITARY SERVICE.
- 8 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 611 IN
- 9 MONTGOMERY COUNTY, BETWEEN MAPLE AVENUE AND MEETINGHOUSE ROAD,
- 10 IS HEREBY DESIGNATED AS THE LIEUTENANT JOSEPH C. PARK II
- 11 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 12 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 13 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 14 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 15 SECTION 5. STAFF SERGEANT KEITH A. BENNETT HIGHWAY.
- 16 (A) FINDINGS AND DECLARATIONS. -- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS
- 17 AND DECLARES:
- 18 (1) STAFF SERGEANT KEITH A. BENNETT WAS A PROUD 1991
- 19 GRADUATE OF SOLANCO HIGH SCHOOL.
- 20 (2) AS A MEMBER OF THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD,
- 21 STAFF SERGEANT BENNETT WAS KILLED IN ACTION IN IRAQ ON
- 22 DECEMBER 11, 2005.
- 23 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF STATE ROUTE 272 IN
- 24 LANCASTER COUNTY, SOUTH OF STATE ROUTE 372 AND BEFORE OSCEOLA
- 25 ROAD, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE STAFF SERGEANT KEITH A. BENNETT
- 26 HIGHWAY.
- 27 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 28 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 29 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 30 SECTION 6. ED BRADLEY WAY.

- 1 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 2 FOLLOWS:
- 3 (1) MR. ED BRADLEY WAS BORN IN PHILADELPHIA AND
- 4 GRADUATED FROM SAINT THOMAS MORE CATHOLIC BOYS HIGH SCHOOL IN
- 5 WEST PHILADELPHIA IN 1959.
- 6 (2) MR. BRADLEY GRADUATED FROM CHEYNEY STATE COLLEGE,
- 7 NOW CHEYNEY UNIVERSITY, IN 1964 WITH A DEGREE IN EDUCATION
- 8 AND HIS FIRST JOB WAS TEACHING SIXTH GRADE AT WILLIAM B. MANN
- 9 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN PHILADELPHIA.
- 10 (3) MR. BRADLEY STARTED REPORTING THE NEWS AT WDAS-FM
- AND, IN 1971, THIS LED HIM TO A FULL-TIME JOB AT WCBS IN NEW
- 12 YORK.
- 13 (4) IN 1972, MR. BRADLEY VOLUNTEERED TO BE TRANSFERRED
- 14 TO SAIGON TO COVER THE VIETNAM WAR IN VIETNAM AND CAMBODIA,
- WHERE HE WAS INJURED BY A MORTAR ROUND.
- 16 (5) IN 1976, MR. BRADLEY BECAME THE FIRST AFRICAN-
- 17 AMERICAN WHITE HOUSE TELEVISION CORRESPONDENT FOR CBS NEWS.
- 18 (6) IN 1981, MR. BRADLEY JOINED THE TELEVISION PROGRAM
- 19 60 MINUTES, WHERE, OVER THE COURSE OF HIS 26 YEARS ON THE
- 20 PROGRAM, HE DID OVER 500 STORIES.
- 21 (7) MR. BRADLEY ALSO HOSTED THE PEABODY AWARD-WINNING
- 22 PROGRAM "JAZZ AT LINCOLN CENTER" ON NATIONAL PUBLIC RADIO FOR
- MORE THAN TEN YEARS, UNTIL HIS DEATH IN 2006.
- 24 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE PORTION OF U.S. ROUTE 1, CITY AVENUE
- 25 IN PHILADELPHIA AND MONTGOMERY COUNTIES FROM ITS INTERSECTION
- 26 WITH PRESIDENTIAL BOULEVARD TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH MONUMENT
- 27 ROAD IS HEREBY DESIGNATED AS ED BRADLEY WAY.
- 28 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 29 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 30 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS.

- 1 Section $\frac{3}{7}$. Effective date.
- 2 This act shall take effect in 60 days. AS FOLLOWS: <--
- 3 (1) SECTION 5 AND THIS SECTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 4 IMMEDIATELY.
- 5 (2) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60
- 6 DAYS.
