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## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled, as amended, "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs in the Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," providing for authorization of school of cosmetology as institution of postsecondary education.

15	Section 1. The act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred

20	shall be recognized and authorized as an institution of
