SENATE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE AMENDMENTS, IN SENATE, JUNE 10, 2014

AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, 5 providing for youth suicide awareness and prevention and for child exploitation awareness education. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections 11 12 to read: 13 14 a vouth 15 16

- 1 (d) (1). A school entity that adopts a youth suicide awareness
- 2 and prevention policy shall distribute the policy to all school
- 3 <u>entity employes and independent contractors and to the parent or</u>
- 4 legal quardian of each student enrolled in the school entity and
- 5 shall post the policy on the school entity's publicly accessible
- 6 <u>Internet website.</u>
- 7 (b) A school entity may develop an age appropriate youth
- 8 suicide awareness and prevention education program and may
- 9 <u>incorporate the program into the school entity's existing</u>
- 10 curriculum for students in grade six through grade twelve. In
- 11 developing the program, the school entity may use the model
- 12 <u>curriculum developed by the department under subsection (d)(2).</u>
- 13 (c) (1) Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, the
- 14 professional development plan submitted by each school entity to
- 15 the secretary for approval pursuant to section 1205.1 shall-
- 16 <u>include four (4) hours of training in youth suicide awareness</u>
- 17 and prevention every five (5) years for professional educators
- 18 assigned to provide instruction to students in grade six, seven,
- 19 eight, nine, ten, eleven or twelve. Training under this
- 20 subsection may be used to satisfy a professional educator's
- 21 continuing professional education requirement under section
- 22 1205.2.
- 23 (2) A school entity that offers its students a youth suicide
- 24 awareness and prevention education program under subsection (b)
- 25 shall ensure that the professional development plan submitted
- 26 under paragraph (1) includes training in the school entity's
- 27 youth suicide awareness and prevention education program.
- 28 (3) A school entity may provide youth suicide awareness and
- 29 prevention education to its other employes and independent
- 30 contractors, in addition to its professional employes.

- 1 (d) Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective
- 2 date of this section, the department, in consultation with a
- 3 youth suicide prevention organization operating in this
- 4 <u>Commonwealth</u>, shall do all of the following:
- 5 (1) Develop a model youth suicide awareness and prevention
- 6 policy and post the model policy on its publicly accessible
- 7 Internet website. The model policy shall include the following:
- 8 <u>(i) A protocol for administering youth suicide awareness and</u>
- 9 prevention education to staff and students.
- 10 (ii) A protocol that identifies:
- 11 (A) Methods of prevention, including procedures for early
- 12 <u>identification and referral of students at risk of suicide.</u>
- 13 (B) Methods of intervention, including procedures that
- 14 <u>address an emotional or mental health safety plan for students</u>
- 15 <u>identified as being at increased risk of suicide.</u>
- 16 (C) Methods of responding to a suicide or suicide attempt by
- 17 a student or employe of the school entity.
- 18 (D) Reporting procedures.
- 19 (E) Recommended resources on youth suicide and youth suicide
- 20 awareness and prevention programs, including contact information
- 21 for such programs.
- 22 (2) Develop a model youth suicide awareness and prevention
- 23 curriculum and make the model curriculum available to all school
- 24 entities and, upon request, to nonpublic schools.
- 25 (3) Compile, develop and post on its publicly accessible
- 26 Internet website recommended guidelines and educational
- 27 materials for the training required under subsection (c), which
- 28 may include materials which are already publicly available. In
- 29 providing the training required under subsection (c), a school
- 30 entity shall not be required to use the quidelines and materials

- 1 developed and made available by the department.
- 2 (e) (1) The State board shall conduct a study regarding the
- 3 manner in which youth suicide awareness and prevention education
- 4 <u>is offered by school entities in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 5 (2) In developing the study required under this subsection,
- 6 <u>the State board shall consult with a youth suicide prevention</u>
- 7 organization operating in this Commonwealth.
- 8 (3) In conducting the study required under this subsection,
- 9 the State board shall request that each school entity provide
- 10 the State board with information concerning whether the school
- 11 <u>entity offers such instruction and the manner in which such</u>
- 12 <u>instruction is offered</u>. Each school entity shall provide the
- 13 <u>information to the State board in response to a request under</u>
- 14 <u>this paragraph.</u>
- 15 (4) Following the 2016-2017 school year, but not later than
- 16 November 30, 2017, the State board shall issue a report to the
- 17 Governor, the secretary, the chairman and minority chairman of
- 18 the Education Committee of the Senate and the chairman and
- 19 minority chairman of the Education Committee of the House of
- 20 Representatives addressing the following:
- 21 (i) The number of school entities adopting a youth suicide
- 22 awareness and prevention policy.
- 23 (ii) The number of school entities adopting the model youth
- 24 suicide awareness and prevention policy developed by the
- 25 <u>department under subsection (d)(1).</u>
- 26 (iii) The number of school entities offering instruction in
- 27 <u>youth suicide awareness and prevention</u>.
- 28 <u>(iv) The number of school entities using the model youth</u>
- 29 suicide awareness and prevention curriculum developed and made
- 30 available by the department pursuant to subsection (d)(2).

- 1 (v) The number of school entities using the recommended
- 2 guidelines and educational materials compiled and developed by
- 3 the department under subsection (d) (3) for the training required
- 4 under subsection (c).
- 5 (vi) A description of the manner in which school entities
- 6 <u>are offering instruction in youth suicide awareness and</u>
- 7 prevention, including the number of hours of instruction
- 8 offered, the grade levels at which such instruction is offered
- 9 and the courses within which such instruction is integrated.
- 10 (vii) Recommendations for improvements to the offering of
- 11 <u>instruction in youth suicide awareness and prevention, including</u>
- 12 <u>recommended legislation.</u>
- 13 <u>(f) For purposes of this section, the following words and</u>

- 30 Section 1527. Child Exploitation Awareness Education. (a)

- 1 Each school entity may develop an age appropriate child
- 2 exploitation awareness education program and may incorporate the
- 3 program into the school entity's existing curriculum for
- 4 students in kindergarten through grade eight. In developing the
- 5 program, the school entity may use the model quidelines and
- 6 educational materials made available by the department pursuant
- 7 to subsection (c) (1) and (2).
- 8 (b) (1) Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, the

- 18 (2) A school entity that incorporates child exploitation
- 19 awareness education into its curriculum under subsection (a)
- 20 shall ensure that the professional development plan submitted
- 21 under paragraph (1) includes training in the school entity's
- 22 child exploitation awareness education program.
- 23 (3) A school entity may provide child exploitation awareness
- 24 training to its other employes and independent contractors, in
- 25 addition to its professional employes.
- 26 (c) Within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective
- 27 date of this section, the department, through its Office for
- 28 Safe Schools and in consultation with at least one organization
- 29 <u>addressing child exploitation</u>, shall do all of the following:
- 30 (1) Develop and post on its publicly accessible Internet

- 1 website model guidelines that school entities may use in
- 2 <u>developing an education program under subsection (a).</u>
- 3 (2) Compile or develop age appropriate educational materials
- 4 regarding child exploitation awareness, which may include
- 5 <u>educational materials that are already publicly available, and</u>
- 6 make the materials available to school entities and, upon
- 7 request, to nonpublic schools.
- 8 (3) Compile, develop and post on its publicly accessible
- 9 <u>Internet website recommended guidelines and educational</u>
- 10 materials for the training required under subsection (b), which
- 11 may include materials which are already publicly available. In
- 12 providing the training required under subsection (b), a school
- 13 <u>entity shall not be required to use the guidelines and materials</u>
- 14 <u>developed and made available by the department.</u>
- 15 (d) (1) The State board shall conduct a study regarding the
- 16 <u>manner in which instruction in child exploitation awareness is</u>
- 17 offered by school entities in this Commonwealth.
- 18 (2) In developing the study required under this subsection,
- 19 the State board shall consult with at least one organization
- 20 addressing child exploitation.
- 21 (3) In conducting the study required under this subsection,
- 22 the State board shall request that each school entity provide
- 23 the State board with information concerning whether the school
- 24 entity offers such instruction and the manner in which such
- 25 instruction is offered. Each school entity shall provide the
- 26 information to the State board in response to a request under
- 27 this paragraph.
- 28 (4) Following the 2016 2017 school year, but not later than
- 29 November 30, 2017, the State board shall issue a report to the
