AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for a volunteer health care practitioner certification; and imposing powers and duties on the Department of Health.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Volunteer
8	Health Care Practitioner Act.
9	Section 2. Legislative findings.
10	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
11	(1) One million residents in this Commonwealth are
12	without health insurance.
13	(2) The Commonwealth provided over \$950 million in
14	uncompensated health care in 2011, up from \$460 million in
15	2001.
16	(3) Hospital emergency rooms are treating many nonurgent
17	medical conditions because patients perceive that they have
18	no other choices.

(4) Medicaid expenditures in this Commonwealth now
 exceed \$7.5 billion per year.

3 (5) Medicaid mandates are placing additional financial
4 burdens on hospitals, physicians and dentists, directly
5 impacting the quality and delivery of health care services.

6 (6) The proposed expansion of Medicaid is causing an 7 impending fiscal crisis.

8 (7) Federal law provides full immunity to physicians and 9 other health care professionals while they volunteer in 10 nonprofit free clinics that treat the poor and charge no fee.

(8) Expanding physicians' civil immunity from tort claims in exchange for their ongoing commitments to charitable practice in free clinics can improve low income patients' access to a range of medical options while reducing Medicaid utilization and expenditures.

16 Section 3. Definitions.

17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 18 have the meanings given to them in this section, unless the 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:

20 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
21 "Free clinic." A health care facility that is licensed under
22 the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health
23 Care Facilities Act, is operated by a nonprofit private entity
24 and meets all of the following criteria:

(1) The facility does not accept reimbursements for
health care services from any third-party payer, including
reimbursements under any insurance policies or health
benefits plans, or under any Federal or State health benefits
programs. The facility may accept voluntary donations for the
provision of services.

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1 (2) The facility does not impose charges on patients or 2 impose a charge according to the patient's ability to pay the 3 charge.

4 (3) The services at the facility are provided by
5 volunteer health care practitioners.

6 "Free clinic offsite program." A program or event operated 7 by a free clinic through which qualifying health services are 8 provided to patients at a site other than the free clinic, which 9 may include a volunteer health care practitioner's customary 10 practice location or another location, as appropriate.

"Health care practitioner." An individual authorized to practice a component of the healing arts by a license, permit, certificate or registration issued by a State licensing agency or board under 49 Pa. Code Pt. I Subpt. A (relating to professional and occupational affairs).

16 "Qualifying health services." As defined under section 224 17 of the Public Health Service Act (58 Stat. 682, 42 U.S.C. § 18 233).

19 Section 4. Certification.

(1)

(a) Application.--The department shall certify an individual
as a volunteer health care practitioner if, at the time of
application for certification, all of the following apply:

The individual is a health care practitioner.

(2) The individual provides documentation to the
department certifying that the individual is deemed to be an
employee of a free clinic providing qualifying health
services.

(3) The individual and the medical director of the free
clinic provide documentation to the department certifying
that, prior to the application date and within the calendar

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quarter of application, the individual has performed at least four hours per week for four consecutive weeks of qualifying health services at the free clinic or free clinic offsite program.

5 (b) Maintenance.--To maintain certification as a volunteer 6 health care practitioner, an individual shall meet all of the 7 following:

8 (1) Continue to meet the criteria under subsection 9 (a)(1) and (2).

10 (2) Provide documentation to the department, on a 11 quarterly basis, certifying that the individual has provided 12 not less than 48 hours per calendar quarter of qualifying 13 health services at a free clinic or a free clinic offsite 14 program. The documentation shall include verification, by the 15 medical director of the free clinic, of the qualifying health 16 services provided.

17 (c) Termination.--The department shall immediately terminate 18 the certification of an individual if the individual fails to 19 meet the requirements under subsection (b).

20 Section 5. Immunity.

21 (a) General rule. -- An individual who is certified by the department as a volunteer health care practitioner under this 22 23 act shall be immune from civil liability for any personal injury 24 to or wrongful death of a patient that is a result of any act or 25 omission in the course of providing care or treatment if the 26 care or treatment was reasonably provided in good faith and if 27 the individual was acting within the scope of his practice. 28 Immunity granted under this section does not apply to an act or 29 omission that was the result of gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct. 30

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(b) Remedy.--The exclusive remedy for injury or damage
 suffered as a result of any act or omission of a volunteer
 health care practitioner is by commencement of an action against
 the Commonwealth in a court of competent jurisdiction.
 Section 6. Rules and regulations.

6 The department shall adopt rules and regulations to 7 effectuate the purposes of this act.

8 Section 7. Effective date.

9 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
