AN ACT

1 2	Providing Statewide uniformity regarding vacation and other forms of leave mandated by political subdivisions.
3	The General Assembly finds that any mandate requiring an
4	employer to provide vacation and other forms of leave to an
5	employee or class of employees in this Commonwealth is a matter
6	of Statewide concern and that the enactment of any mandate by a
7	political subdivision in this Commonwealth requiring an employer
8	to provide an employee or class of employees with vacation or
9	other forms of leave, paid or unpaid, that is not required by
10	Federal or State law, or the administration by a political
11	subdivision of Federally mandated or State-mandated leave in a
12	manner incongruous with Federal and State law, would defeat
13	Statewide uniformity.
14	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15	hereby enacts as follows:
16	Section 1. Short title.
17	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Leave Policy

1 Act.

2 Section 2. Definitions.

3 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 4 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 5 context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Employee." As defined in section 3 of the act of January
17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968.
"Employer." As defined in section 3 of the act of January
17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968.
"Political subdivision." Any county, city, borough,
incorporated town, township, school district, vocational school
district and county institution district.

13 Section 3. Mandate prohibition.

A political subdivision in this Commonwealth may not enact or 14 15 administer a mandate requiring an employer to provide an 16 employee or class of employees with vacation or other forms of 17 leave from employment, paid or unpaid, that is not required by Federal or State law, and may not require an employer to 18 compensate an employee for any vacation or other forms of leave 19 20 for which Federal or State law does not require the employee to 21 be compensated.

22 Section 4. Applicability.

This act does not apply to any mandate enacted by a political subdivision of this Commonwealth affecting vacation or other forms of leave for an employee or class of employees of the political subdivision.

27 Section 5. Inconsistent mandate.

28 Any mandate enacted by a political subdivision of this <--</p>
29 Commonwealth that is inconsistent with this act and that is in
30 effect on the effective date of this act is void.

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NOTHING IN THIS ACT SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO INVALIDATE A
 MANDATE THAT IS ENACTED BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION PRIOR TO
 JANUARY 1, 2014. ANY MANDATE ENACTED BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION
 THAT IS INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ACT AND ENACTED AFTER JANUARY 1,
 2014, IS VOID.
