## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for General Educational Development Test.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	Section 1613.1. General Educational Development Test(a)
13	The General Assembly finds and declares:
14	(1) In this Commonwealth approximately twelve percent (12%)
15	of residents twenty-five years of age and older do not have a
16	<u>high school diploma.</u>
17	(2) The Commonwealth permits adults who do not possess a
18	secondary school diploma and are not enrolled in a public or

1	non-public school to obtain a Commonwealth secondary school
2	diploma upon passing the GED test.
3	(3) The GED test was created by the American Council on
4	Education as a public service for veterans returning from World
5	War II in 1942.
6	(4) The current GED test was last revised in 2002 and is
7	known as the 2002 Series GED test, which is comprised of five
8	parts.
9	(5) The 2002 Series GED will expire December 31, 2013, and,
10	beginning January 2, 2014, the Commonwealth will only offer the
11	<u>2014 GED test.</u>
12	(6) Individuals who have begun the 2002 Series GED test but
13	have not successfully completed all five parts will be required
14	to restart the new test in 2014.
15	(7) On the effective date of this section, approximately
16	fifty-one thousand (51,000) people have taken at least part of
17	the 2002 Series GED since 2002 and have not yet passed, with
18	over fifteen thousand (15,000) Commonwealth residents with
19	incomplete scores on the 2002 Series GED, which the individual
20	will no longer be able to use to obtain the high school
21	equivalency credential.
22	(b) It is the intent of this section to give an individual
23	with incomplete scores additional time to obtain high school
24	equivalency credentials using the scores that the individual has
25	already successfully obtained so as many Commonwealth residents
26	<u>as possible can pursue better employment opportunities.</u>
27	(c) Subject to subsection (d), within sixty (60) days of the
28	effective date of this section, the Department of Education
29	shall establish and implement a testing program by which
30	individuals who have successfully completed at least one section
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1	<u>of the GED test prior to January 1, 2014, may obtain a</u>
2	Commonwealth secondary school diploma by using passing scores
3	obtained prior to January 1, 2014, on the completed sections.
4	(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, regulation
5	or Department of Education policy, each individual who has
6	successfully completed at least one section of the GED test
7	prior to January 1, 2014, shall have eighteen (18) months from
8	the effective date of this section to complete the testing
9	program established under subsection (a) (C).
10	(e) This section shall expire eighteen (18) months from the
11	effective date of this section.
12	(f) For the purposes of this section, the term "GED test"
13	shall mean the General Educational Development test published by
14	the General Educational Testing Service of the American Council
15	on Education and administered under the authority of the
16	Department of Education.
17	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
