_0	graduation if the elective credit option exists within the
1	academic major.
_2	(2) A public institution of higher education may not
13	require students who are awarded college course credits under
4	<pre>paragraph (1) to obtain additional college course credits</pre>
_5	toward satisfying degree requirements for graduation.

_7	institutions of higher education for those public institutions
8 .	of higher education required to participate and those
9	independent institutions of higher education that elect to-

22	report to the department all of the following:
23	(1) Number of students admitted who took advanced
24	placement courses in high school.
25	(2) Total number of credits awarded based on advanced
26	placement exam scores.
27	(3) Number of credits awarded per matriculating advanced
28	placement students based on advanced placement courses taken.
29	(4) Number of credits awarded to matriculating advanced
30	placement students toward major.

- 3 <u>(e) Information and assistance. Information provided under</u>
- 4 <u>subsection (d) shall be reported by the department to the</u>

- 8 (f) Definitions. As used in this section, the term
- 9 <u>"advanced placement course" means a high school-level</u>
