AN ACT

1 2 3	Requiring certain health care practitioners to disseminate information relating to Down syndrome; and imposing duties on the Department of Health.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Down Syndrome
8	Prenatal and Postnatal Education Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.

1 "Down syndrome." A chromosomal condition caused by an error 2 in cell division that results in the presence of an extra or 3 partial copy of chromosome 21.

4 "Health care practitioner." A person who is licensed,
5 certified or otherwise authorized by law or regulation to
6 provide or render health care services or genetic counseling to
7 expectant or new parents.

8 Section 3. Dissemination of information on Down syndrome. 9 (a) Requirement.--A health care practitioner that 10 administers, or causes to be administered, a test for Down 11 syndrome to an expectant or new parent shall, upon receiving a 12 test result that is positive for Down syndrome, provide the 13 expectant or new parent with educational information made 14 available by the department under section 4.

(b) Compliance.--Delivery of information prepared by the department in accordance with section 4 at the time genetic results or diagnostic conclusions are provided shall constitute compliance with this section.

19 Section 4. Informational publications by department.

(a) General rule.--The department shall make the following
available to health care practitioners on the department's
publicly accessible Internet website:

(1) Up-to-date, evidence-based information about Down
syndrome that has been reviewed by medical experts and
national Down syndrome organizations. The information
provided shall include the following:

27 (i) Physical, developmental, educational and28 psychosocial outcomes.

29 (ii) Life expectancy.

30 (iii) Clinical course.

5	(2) Contact information regarding First Call programs

16	(b) FormThe information provided in accordance with this
17	act shall conform to the applicable standard or standards
18	provided in the Enhanced National Standards for Culturally and
19	Linguistically Appropriate Services in Health and Health Care as
20	adopted by the United States Department of Health and Human
21	Services and published in the Federal Register on September 24,
22	2013.
23	Section 5. Effective date.
24	This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
