1 2 3 4	Providing for certain limitations on residential care provider contracts; and prohibiting Commonwealth agencies from entering into agreements that provide housing at State-owned facilities to unaccompanied alien children.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Unaccompanied
9	Alien Children Housing Act.
10	Section 2. Declaration of purpose.
11	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
12	(1) Between October of 2013 and June of 2014,
13	approximately 60,000 unaccompanied alien children have
14	entered the country by way of the United States' southern
15	border.
16	(2) The Department of Health and Human Services' Office
17	of Refugee Resettlement (HHS-ORR) has made few attempts to
18	keep State public officials informed of who is coming in this
19	Commonwealth via the Unaccompanied Alien Children Program

1 serviced through HHS-ORR.

2 (3) State-licensed care facilities in Pennsylvania are
3 contracting with HHS-ORR to provide temporary housing,
4 education and medical care to unaccompanied alien children.

5 (4) When unaccompanied alien children are housed in 6 residential care facilities licensed or owned by the 7 Commonwealth, the Commonwealth has a vested interest in 8 monitoring contracts entered into by those facilities. 9 Section 3. Definitions.

10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:

13 "Commonwealth agency." The Commonwealth, including any 14 agency, department, board, commission or office of the executive 15 branch, judicial branch or legislative branch. The term includes 16 a political subdivision and municipal authority.

17 "HHS-ORR." The Department of Health and Human Services'18 Office of Refugee Resettlement.

"License." A document issued by the Commonwealth that grants permission to one of the following entities to provide housing to minors in basic shelters, group homes, staff secure, secure and other specialized types of care:

23 (1) Community home services agency.

24 (2) Community home services agency large home.

- 25 (3) Long-term structured residence.
- 26 (4) Family based services.
- 27 (5) Personal care homes.
- 28 (6) Foster family care.
- 29 (7) Family living home services agency.
- 30 (8) Intermediate care facility for persons with

2	(9) Residential services.
3	(10) Secure care.
4	(11) Secure detention.
5	(12) Transitional living.
6	(13) Intermediate care facility for mental health.
7	(14) Any other type of residential care facility that
8	maintains licenses issued by the Commonwealth.
9	"Program." HHS-ORR's Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program
10	that facilitates housing for unaccompanied alien children.
11	"Residential care provider." An entity that holds a license.
12	"State-owned facility." A facility owned by the Commonwealth
13	that meets existing or future requirements to house
14	unaccompanied alien children.
15	"Unaccompanied alien children." A child who:
16	(1) is an alien who is not lawfully present in the
17	United States;
18	(2) has not attained 18 years of age; and
19	(3) with respect to whom:
20	(i) there is no parent or legal guardian in the
21	United States; or
22	(ii) no parent or legal guardian in the United
23	States is available to provide care and physical custody.
24	Section 4. Limitations of residential care provider contracts.
25	The Commonwealth shall revoke the license of any residential
26	care provider that enters into an agreement with HHS-ORR, after
27	the effective date of this section, to provide housing to
28	unaccompanied alien children.
29	Section 5. Prohibition.
30	No Commonwealth agency may enter into an agreement with HHS-

ORR or any other division of the Federal Government to provide
 housing to unaccompanied alien children within a State-owned
 facility.

4 Section 6. Applicability.

5 An agreement entered into prior to the effective date of this 6 section between a residential care provider and HHS-ORR shall 7 not result in license revocation for the remaining term of that 8 contract, unless the contract is renewed or extended.

9 Section 7. Effective date.

10 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
