## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring and commemorating March 12, 2013, as the 101st
- anniversary of the Girl Scouts.
- 3 WHEREAS, Juliette Gordon Low dreamed of an organization that
- 4 would give each girl an opportunity to develop physically,
- 5 mentally and spiritually; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Girl Scouts helped girls emerge from isolated
- 7 home environments and enter into the world of community service
- 8 and the open air; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts hiked, camped, learned to tell time by
- 10 the stars and studied first aid; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The organization was founded March 12, 1912, in
- 12 Savannah, Georgia, when Juliette Gordon Low gathered 18 girls

- 1 together to register the first troop of American Girl Guides;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, The organization's name was changed to the Girl
- 4 Scouts the following year; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Throughout its distinguished history, Girl Scouting
- 6 has inspired millions of girls and women with the highest ideals
- 7 of courage, confidence and character; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting takes an active role in increasing
- 9 girls' awareness of the opportunities available to them today in
- 10 mathematics, science, sports, technology and other fields that
- 11 can expand their horizons; and
- 12 WHEREAS, By 1920, the Girls Scouts had nearly 70,000 members
- 13 nationwide, including the territory of Hawaii; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Juliette Gordon Low encouraged girls to prepare for
- 15 possible future roles as professional women in the arts,
- 16 sciences and business and for active citizenship outside the
- 17 home; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Girl Scout leadership experience allows girls to
- 19 develop the skills and learn lessons that will serve them for a
- 20 lifetime so that they may contribute to their communities; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The Girl Scouts organization welcomed girls with
- 22 disabilities with open arms at a time when they were often
- 23 excluded from many other activities; and
- 24 WHEREAS, From the seed planted by Juliette Gordon Low and
- 25 those original 18 girls, Girl Scouting has grown to an
- 26 organization of 3.2 million Girl Scouts, with 2.3 million girl
- 27 members and 880,000 adult members who work primarily as
- 28 volunteers; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Through its membership in the World Association of
- 30 Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), Girl Scouts in the United

- 1 States of America are part of a worldwide community of 10
- 2 million members in 145 countries; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The 8,984 troops across this Commonwealth are
- 4 comprised of 103,574 girl members and 39,352 adult volunteers;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, For over a century, participation in the Girl Scouts
- 7 has helped girls develop their full individual potential, relate
- 8 to others with increasing understanding, skill and respect,
- 9 develop values to guide their actions and provide the foundation
- 10 for sound decision making and contribute to the improvement of
- 11 society through their abilities, leadership skills and
- 12 cooperation with others; therefore be it
- 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor and
- 14 commemorate March 12, 2013, as the 101st anniversary of the
- 15 Girls Scouts and join with the more than 3 million current Girl
- 16 Scout members nationwide and the nearly 59 million former Girl
- 17 Scouts nationwide in proudly celebrating a century of the
- 18 important impact of Girl Scouts on all Pennsylvanians; and be it
