A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to 1 conduct a study of the current system used by the 2 Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, State-related institutions and community colleges in charging tuition and fees for enrollment and to examine the impact that a "Pay It Forward" program would have in this Commonwealth. 6 7 WHEREAS, The General Assembly recognizes that postsecondary 8 education is a foundation for democracy and has expanded opportunities for citizens of this Commonwealth to qualify for 10 high-quality jobs and entry into the middle class, providing 11 clear benefits to this Commonwealth's economy; and 12 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education's State funding level in the 2012-2013 fiscal year was only \$1 13 million more than it was 15 years ago, constituting a 14 15 significant decrease in inflation-adjusted terms; and 16 WHEREAS, In response to decreased State support, over the 17 past ten years in-State tuition in this Commonwealth has risen 18 by over \$2,000, or 44%, at State System of Higher Education institutions and by an average of more than \$5,500, or 57%, at 19

- 2 WHEREAS, Tuition at Pennsylvania's public institutions of
- 3 higher education has been rising far more rapidly than household
- 4 incomes; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Students and their families provide approximately
- 6 73% of the revenue necessary to operate State System of Higher
- 7 Education institutions through tuition and fees; and
- 8 WHEREAS, For the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the Pennsylvania
- 9 Higher Education Assistance Agency's Federal loan servicing
- 10 operation has grown from \$76 billion for 4.3 million borrowers
- 11 to \$108 billion for 5.2 million borrowers in early 2013, with a
- 12 probability of ending the fiscal year with a portfolio of \$125
- 13 billion for approximately 5.9 million borrowers; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The increasing unaffordability of a college
- 15 education has forced students to borrow more money to pay for
- 16 higher education; and
- 17 WHEREAS, High levels of student debt are not only damaging to
- 18 the individual student's ability to succeed financially, but
- 19 will also have a detrimental effect on the economy of this
- 20 Commonwealth; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The General Assembly finds that it must immediately
- 22 seek another approach to financing the students' share of the
- 23 cost of public higher education in this Commonwealth that will
- 24 not result in students graduating from Pennsylvania's public
- 25 colleges and universities burdened with an unsustainable level
- 26 of debt; and
- 27 WHEREAS, There is growing interest in a new financing
- 28 strategy known as "Pay It Forward"; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 30 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study of

- 1 the current system used by the State System of Higher Education,
- 2 State-related institutions and community colleges in charging
- 3 tuition and fees for enrollment and to examine the impact that a
- 4 "Pay It Forward" program would have in this Commonwealth; and be
- 5 it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the study include, but not be limited to, an
- 7 analysis of the funding and logistical challenges of a pilot
- 8 program to test the "Pay It Forward" program, which would
- 9 replace the system of charging tuition and fees for higher
- 10 education for participating students with a contract signed by a
- 11 student to commit a certain percentage of the student's annual
- 12 adjusted gross income upon completion of the student's course of
- 13 study for a specified number of years; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the study also include an analysis of the
- 15 "Western Tuition Promise" offered by Western Oregon University;
- 16 the "Finish in Four" program proposed in Florida; the "Pay It
- 17 Forward, Pay It Back" program proposed in Oregon; the "Pay It
- 18 Forward" system proposed in Washington; and ways of mitigating
- 19 the financial strain that the adoption of a tuition freeze would
- 20 place on university finances; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 22 prepare a report of its findings and transmit copies of the
- 23 report to the Education Committee, the Finance Committee and the
- 24 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives not
- 25 later than two years after adoption of this resolution.
