A RESOLUTION

- Designating October 2014 as "Senior Bully Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, October is National Bullying Prevention Month and
- 4 this yearly campaign unites communities nationwide to educate
- 5 and raise awareness of bullying prevention; and
- 6 WHEREAS, It is generally believed that 4% to 6% of elderly
- 7 persons are abused; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Throughout the world, abuse and neglect of elderly
- 9 persons is largely unrecognized; and
- 10 WHEREAS, No state or municipality is immune from this costly
- 11 public health and human rights crisis; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Research indicates that public education events such
- 13 as National Bullying Prevention Month are vital for raising
- 14 community awareness of, and mobilizing community action against,

- 1 elder abuse and neglect and financial exploitation of elderly
- 2 persons; and
- 3 WHEREAS, As the population ages and more Americans become
- 4 senior citizens with life savings, they become greater targets
- 5 for fraud and deception; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The ease of access for criminals to contact seniors
- 7 through the Internet and telephone increases as more creative
- 8 schemes emerge; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Senior fraud is a growing concern as millions have
- 10 fallen victim to scams, including Medicare scams, sweepstakes
- 11 and lottery scams, investment and work-at-home scams,
- 12 bereavement scams, identity theft, charity scams, granny scams
- 13 and home repair scams; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Senior citizens average one scam-type letter and two
- 15 telemarketing phone calls per week; and
- 16 WHEREAS, There are about five million cases of financial
- 17 exploitation of elderly persons in the United States each year
- 18 and the financial loss by victims is more than \$2.9 billion
- 19 annually for reported cases; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Approximately 1.6 to 2 million seniors become
- 21 victims of abuse or neglect in domestic and institutional
- 22 settings in the United States every year; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The four most common forms of elder abuse are
- 24 physical abuse, including sexual abuse, psychological and
- 25 emotional abuse, financial/material abuse and neglect; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Most elder abuse victims are dependent on their
- 27 abusers for basic needs; and
- 28 WHEREAS, At least one in nine Americans who are 60 years of
- 29 age or older has experienced some form of elder abuse; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Seniors who have been abused have a 300% higher risk

- 1 of death when compared to those who have not been abused; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In almost 90% of elder abuse and neglect incidents,
- 3 the perpetrator is a family member, and two-thirds of
- 4 perpetrators are adult children or spouses; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Almost 50% of seniors with dementia experience some
- 6 form of abuse; and
- 7 WHEREAS, For every reported incident of elder abuse, five
- 8 others go unreported; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While 91% of Federal abuse prevention dollars are
- 10 spent on child abuse, 7% are spent on domestic abuse and only 2%
- 11 are allocated to protect elderly persons; therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 13 month of October 2014 as "Senior Bully Awareness Month" in
- 14 Pennsylvania.
