- Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the <--2 makeup, jurisdiction and venue of the Philadelphia Municipal Court; restricting and eliminating the Traffic Court of Philadelphia; and making an editorial change.
