AN ACT

1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
2 act relating to the public school system, including certain
3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
5 laws relating thereto," further providing for school police <--
6 officers. IN GROUNDS AND BUILDINGS, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR <--
7 SALE OF UNUSED AND UNNECESSARY LANDS AND BUILDINGS AND FOR
8 SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS; AND, IN SAFE SCHOOLS, FURTHER
9 PROVIDING FOR OFFICE FOR SAFE SCHOOLS.

10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11 hereby enacts as follows:

12 Section 1. Section 778(f) of the act of March 10, 1949 <--
13 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
14 amended June 25, 1997 (P.L.297, No.30), is amended and the
15 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:

16 SECTION 1. SECTION 707(8) OF THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 <--
17 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN AS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949,
18 AMENDED DECEMBER 21, 1988 (P.L.1321, NO.169), IS AMENDED TO
19 READ:

20 SECTION 707. SALE OF UNUSED AND UNNECESSARY LANDS AND

1 BUILDINGS.--THE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS OF ANY DISTRICT IS
2 HEREBY VESTED WITH THE NECESSARY POWER AND AUTHORITY TO SELL
3 UNUSED AND UNNECESSARY LANDS AND BUILDINGS, BY ANY OF THE
4 FOLLOWING METHODS AND SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS:

6 (8) NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING PROVISIONS OF THIS
7 SECTION, ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE SECOND, THIRD OR FOURTH
8 CLASS, UPON APPROVAL OF TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF THE MEMBERS OF THE
9 BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS OF SUCH DISTRICT, MAY CONVEY ANY
10 UNUSED AND UNNECESSARY LANDS AND BUILDINGS OF THE DISTRICT TO
11 THE CITY, BOROUGH, TOWN [OR], TOWNSHIP OR MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY,
12 THE BOUNDARIES OF WHICH ARE COTERMINOUS WITH OR WITHIN THOSE OF
13 THE DISTRICT OR A VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY, VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE
14 SERVICE OR VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD LOCATED WITHIN THE DISTRICT,
15 WITHOUT CONSIDERATION, OR FOR SUCH CONSIDERATION AND ON SUCH
16 TERMS OF EXCHANGE OR OTHERWISE AS MAY BE AGREED UPON, WITHOUT
17 FIRST COMPLYING WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE FOREGOING
18 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

19 ALL SUCH CONVEYANCES TO A CITY, BOROUGH, TOWN [OR], TOWNSHIP
20 OR MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY SHALL CONTAIN A CLAUSE WHEREBY THE LANDS
21 AND BUILDINGS WILL REVERT TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT IF THEY ARE NO
22 LONGER BEING USED FOR MUNICIPAL OR AUTHORITY PURPOSES, WITH THE
23 FOLLOWING EXCEPTION. IF THE LANDS AND BUILDINGS ACQUIRED FROM A
24 FORMER SCHOOL DISTRICT ARE CONVEYED TO A CITY, BOROUGH, TOWN
25 [OR], TOWNSHIP OR MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY, THE BOUNDARIES OF WHICH
26 ARE COTERMINOUS WITH OR WITHIN THOSE OF THE FORMER SCHOOL
27 DISTRICT, THE CONVEYANCE NEED NOT CONTAIN A REVERTER CLAUSE.
28 HOWEVER, ALL CONVEYANCES TO A VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY, VOLUNTEER
29 AMBULANCE SERVICE OR VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD SHALL CONTAIN A
30 CLAUSE WHEREBY THE LANDS AND BUILDINGS WILL REVERT TO THE SCHOOL

1 DISTRICT IF THEY ARE NO LONGER BEING USED FOR FIRE, AMBULANCE OR
2 RESCUE SERVICES.

4 SECTION 2. SECTION 778 OF THE ACT, AMENDED OR ADDED JUNE 25,
5 1997 (P.L.297, NO.30) AND JULY 4, 2004 (P.L.536, NO.70), IS
6 AMENDED TO READ:

7 Section 778. School Police Officers.--~~* * *~~ (A) ANY SCHOOL <--
8 [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY APPLY TO ANY JUDGE OF
9 THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS OF THE COUNTY WITHIN WHICH THE SCHOOL
10 [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS SITUATED TO APPOINT
11 SUCH PERSON OR PERSONS AS THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SCHOOL
12 [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR ADMINISTRATION OF THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY
13 DESIGNATE TO ACT AS SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER FOR SAID SCHOOL
14 [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL. THE JUDGE, UPON SUCH
15 APPLICATION, MAY APPOINT SUCH PERSON, OR SO MANY OF THEM AS HE
16 MAY DEEM PROPER, TO BE SUCH SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER AND SHALL NOTE
17 THE FACT OF SUCH APPOINTMENT TO BE ENTERED UPON THE RECORDS OF
18 THE COURT. THE JUDGE MAY, AT THE REQUEST OF THE SCHOOL
19 [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL, GRANT THE SCHOOL POLICE
20 OFFICER THE POWER TO ARREST AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) (2),
21 THE AUTHORITY TO ISSUE CITATIONS FOR SUMMARY OFFENSES OR THE
22 AUTHORITY TO DETAIN STUDENTS UNTIL THE ARRIVAL OF LOCAL LAW
23 ENFORCEMENT, OR ANY COMBINATION THEREOF.

24 (A.1) ANY SCHOOL [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL WHICH
25 EMPLOYS A SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL REPORT
26 ANNUALLY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, OFFICE OF SAFE SCHOOLS,
27 THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION REGARDING SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS
28 RECEIVING TRAINING AS REQUIRED UNDER 53 PA.C.S. CH. 21 SUBCH. D
29 (RELATING TO MUNICIPAL POLICE EDUCATION AND TRAINING):

30 (1) THE IDENTITY OF THE SCHOOL [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR

1 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL AND THE NUMBER OF SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS IT
2 EMPLOYS.

3 (2) THE MUNICIPALITIES COMPRISING THE SCHOOL [DISTRICT]
4 ENTITY OR IN WHICH THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS LOCATED.

5 (3) THE DATE AND TYPE OF TRAINING PROVIDED TO EACH SCHOOL
6 POLICE OFFICER.

7 (B) EVERY SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER SO APPOINTED SHALL, BEFORE
8 ENTERING UPON THE DUTIES OF HIS OFFICE, TAKE AND SUBSCRIBE TO
9 THE OATH REQUIRED BY THE SEVENTH ARTICLE OF THE CONSTITUTION,
10 BEFORE AN ALDERMAN OR JUSTICE OF THE PEACE OR PROTHONOTARY. SUCH
11 OATH SHALL BE FILED BY THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, ALDERMAN, OR
12 PROTHONOTARY AMONG HIS PAPERS, AND A NOTE MADE UPON HIS DOCKET
13 OF THE FACT OF THE OATH HAVING BEEN TAKEN.

14 (B.1) EVERY SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER WHO HAS BEEN GRANTED
15 POWERS UNDER SUBSECTION (C) (2) OR (3) OR HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED TO
16 CARRY A FIREARM MUST, BEFORE ENTERING UPON THE DUTIES OF HIS
17 OFFICE, SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE TRAINING AS SET FORTH IN 53
18 PA.C.S. CH. 21 SUBCH. D OR HAVE GRADUATED FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA
19 STATE POLICE ACADEMY AND HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED AS A STATE TROOPER
20 WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE.

21 (C) SUCH SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER SO APPOINTED SHALL SEVERALLY
22 POSSESS AND EXERCISE ALL THE FOLLOWING POWERS AND DUTIES:

23 (1) TO ENFORCE GOOD ORDER IN SCHOOL BUILDINGS, ON SCHOOL
24 BUSES AND ON SCHOOL GROUNDS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE SCHOOL
25 [DISTRICTS] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS
26 CLAUSE, THE TERM "SCHOOL BUS" SHALL INCLUDE VEHICLES LEASED BY
27 THE SCHOOL [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL TO TRANSPORT
28 STUDENTS AND VEHICLES OF MASS TRANSIT USED BY STUDENTS TO GO TO
29 AND FROM SCHOOL WHEN THE SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER IS RESPONDING TO
30 A REPORT OF AN INCIDENT INVOLVING A BREACH OF GOOD ORDER OR

1 VIOLATION OF LAW.

2 (2) IF AUTHORIZED BY THE COURT, TO EXERCISE THE SAME POWERS
3 AS ARE NOW OR MAY HEREAFTER BE EXERCISED UNDER AUTHORITY OF LAW
4 OR ORDINANCE BY THE POLICE OF THE MUNICIPALITY WHEREIN THE
5 SCHOOL PROPERTY IS LOCATED.

6 (3) IF AUTHORIZED BY THE COURT, TO ISSUE SUMMARY CITATIONS
7 OR TO DETAIN INDIVIDUALS UNTIL LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT IS
8 NOTIFIED.

9 (D) SUCH SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER SHALL, WHEN ON DUTY,
10 SEVERALLY WEAR A METALLIC SHIELD OR BADGE WITH THE WORDS "SCHOOL
11 POLICE," AND THE NAME OF THE [DISTRICT] SCHOOL ENTITY OR
12 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL FOR WHICH APPOINTED. SUCH SHIELD SHALL ALWAYS
13 BE WORN IN PLAIN VIEW WHEN ON DUTY EXCEPT WHEN EMPLOYED AS
14 DETECTIVE.

15 (E) THE COMPENSATION OF SUCH SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS SHALL BE
16 PAID BY THE SCHOOL [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL FOR
17 WHICH THE SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS ARE RESPECTIVELY APPOINTED, AS
18 MAY BE AGREED UPON BETWEEN THE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS OR
19 ADMINISTRATION OF THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL AND THE SCHOOL POLICE
20 OFFICER.

21 (f) School [districts] ENTITIES OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS and <--
22 municipalities may enter into cooperative police service
23 agreements pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 8953(e) (relating to
24 Statewide municipal police jurisdiction) and 53 Pa.C.S. § 2303
25 (relating to intergovernmental cooperation authorized) to
26 authorize the exercise of concurrent jurisdiction with local law
27 enforcement within the municipality where the school or school
28 [district] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL is located or within the <--
29 municipality in which a school event or activity will take
30 place.

1 (f.1) (1) If a school is located within a municipality
2 where no municipal police department exists, the school district <--
3 ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL may enter into a cooperative police <--
4 service agreement pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 8953(e) and 53
5 Pa.C.S. § 2303 with a municipality providing full-time police
6 coverage that is located adjacent to the school. At least thirty
7 (30) days prior to executing a cooperative police service
8 agreement under this subsection, the school district ENTITY OR <--
9 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL shall provide written notice of its intent to
10 enter into the agreement to the municipality where the school is
11 located. A copy of the executed agreement shall be provided to
12 the commanding officer of the Pennsylvania State Police
13 installation that provides primary police services to the
14 municipality where the school is located.

15 (2) A cooperative police service agreement entered into
16 under this subsection shall only pertain to actions taken on
17 school property pursuant to the agreement and shall not affect
18 the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania State Police.

19 * * * <--

20 (G) WHEN ACTING WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THIS SECTION, SCHOOL <--
21 POLICE OFFICERS SHALL, AT ALL TIMES, BE EMPLOYES OF THE SCHOOL
22 DISTRICT AND SHALL BE ENTITLED TO ALL OF THE RIGHTS AND BENEFITS
23 ACCRUING THEREFROM.

24 (H) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PRECLUDE A
25 SCHOOL [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL FROM EMPLOYING
26 OTHER SECURITY PERSONNEL AS THE SCHOOL [DISTRICT] ENTITY OR
27 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL DEEMS NECESSARY.

28 (I) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "SCHOOL ENTITY" SHALL HAVE THE
29 SAME MEANING GIVEN TO IT UNDER SECTION 222(C).

30 SECTION 3. SECTION 1302-A(C.1) AND (D) OF THE ACT, AMENDED

1 OR ADDED JULY 18, 2013 (P.L.571, NO.70), ARE AMENDED, SUBSECTION
2 (B) IS AMENDED BY ADDING PARAGRAPHS AND THE SECTION IS AMENDED
3 BY ADDING A SUBSECTION TO READ:

4 SECTION 1302-A. OFFICE FOR SAFE SCHOOLS.--* * *

5 (B) THE OFFICE SHALL HAVE THE POWER AND DUTY TO IMPLEMENT
6 THE FOLLOWING:

7 * * *

8 (8) TO ESTABLISH CRITERIA FOR CERTIFYING APPROVED VENDORS TO
9 PROVIDE SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS TO NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE
10 PURPOSES OF AWARDING GRANTS UNDER SUBSECTION (C.1)(3).

11 (9) TO PUBLISH AND POST ON THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S
12 PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE A LISTING OF ALL APPROVED
13 VENDORS UNDER PARAGRAPH (8).

14 * * *

15 (C.1) (1) IN ADDITION TO THE POWERS AND DUTIES SET FORTH
16 UNDER SUBSECTIONS (B) AND (C), THE OFFICE IS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE
17 TARGETED GRANTS TO SCHOOL ENTITIES [AND TO], MUNICIPALITIES,
18 LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND APPROVED VENDORS TO FUND
19 PROGRAMS WHICH ADDRESS SCHOOL VIOLENCE BY ESTABLISHING OR
20 ENHANCING SCHOOL SECURITY, INCLUDING COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE
21 TRAINING AND COMPENSATION OF SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS AND SCHOOL
22 POLICE OFFICERS. MUNICIPALITIES OR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT
23 AGENCIES THAT RECEIVE GRANTS UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL, WITH
24 THE PRIOR CONSENT OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SCHOOL ENTITY OR
25 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL, ASSIGN SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS TO CARRY OUT
26 THEIR OFFICIAL DUTIES ON THE PREMISES OF THE SCHOOL ENTITY OR
27 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.

28 (2) MUNICIPALITIES OR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES MAY NOT
29 RECEIVE GRANT FUNDS UNDER THIS SUBSECTION FOR ANY PURPOSE OTHER
30 THAN FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS AND ARE

1 NOT ELIGIBLE FOR OTHER GRANTS PROVIDED TO SCHOOL ENTITIES UNDER
2 THIS SECTION. IN ASSIGNING SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS PURSUANT TO
3 THIS SUBSECTION, MUNICIPALITIES SHALL TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION
4 THE PROPORTION OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN EACH SCHOOL ENTITY OR
5 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.

6 (3) NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE AUTHORIZED TO APPLY TO THE OFFICE
7 FOR GRANT FUNDING UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) TO BE USED FOR THE COSTS
8 ASSOCIATED WITH OBTAINING THE SERVICES OF A SCHOOL POLICE
9 OFFICER FROM A LIST OF APPROVED VENDORS CERTIFIED BY THE OFFICE.
10 GRANT AWARDS FOR THIS PURPOSE SHALL BE AWARDED AND PAID DIRECTLY
11 TO THE APPROVED VENDOR WITH WHICH THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL CONTRACTS
12 FOR SERVICES.

13 (D) THE OFFICE SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING DUTIES AS TO
14 TARGETED GRANTS:

15 (1) TARGETED GRANTS SHALL BE ALLOCATED THROUGH A COMPETITIVE
16 GRANT REVIEW PROCESS ESTABLISHED BY THE OFFICE. SCHOOL ENTITIES
17 MUST SATISFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AND SECTION 1303-A
18 TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR GRANTS. THE APPLICATION FOR A TARGETED GRANT
19 SHALL INCLUDE:

20 (I) THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE TARGETED GRANT SHALL BE
21 UTILIZED;

22 (II) INFORMATION INDICATING NEED FOR THE TARGETED GRANT,
23 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, SCHOOL VIOLENCE STATISTICS;

24 (III) AN ESTIMATED BUDGET;

25 (IV) METHODS FOR MEASURING OUTCOMES; AND

26 (V) ANY OTHER CRITERIA AS THE OFFICE MAY REQUIRE.

27 (2) THE OFFICE SHALL:

28 (I) GIVE PRIORITY IN GRANT FUNDING UNDER SUBSECTION (C) TO A
29 SCHOOL ENTITY DESIGNATED AS A PERSISTENTLY DANGEROUS SCHOOL AS
30 DEFINED IN 22 PA. CODE § 403.2 (RELATING TO DEFINITIONS).

1 (II) GIVE PRIORITY IN GRANT FUNDING UNDER SUBSECTION (C) TO
2 SCHOOL ENTITIES WITH THE GREATEST NEED TO ESTABLISH SAFETY AND
3 ORDER.

4 (III) TO THE GREATEST EXTENT POSSIBLE, ENSURE THAT GRANT
5 FUNDING IS GEOGRAPHICALLY DISPERSED TO SCHOOL ENTITIES AND
6 MUNICIPALITIES THROUGHOUT THIS COMMONWEALTH.

7 (IV) FOR SCHOOL ENTITIES [AND], MUNICIPALITIES, LOCAL LAW
8 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT APPLY FOR
9 FUNDING FOR THE TRAINING AND COMPENSATION OF SCHOOL RESOURCE
10 OFFICERS AND SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS UNDER SUBSECTION (C.1), GIVE
11 PRIORITY TO SCHOOL ENTITIES [AND], MUNICIPALITIES, LOCAL LAW
12 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT UTILIZE SCHOOL
13 RESOURCE OFFICERS OR SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS WHO HAVE COMPLETED
14 ADDITIONAL TRAINING RECOMMENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
15 RELATING TO INTERACTION WITH ALL CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS WITHIN
16 A SCHOOL SETTING.

17 (V) FOR SCHOOL ENTITIES OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT APPLY FOR
18 FUNDING FOR SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS UNDER SUBSECTION (C.1), GIVE
19 PRIORITY TO SCHOOL ENTITIES AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT UTILIZE
20 SCHOOL POLICE OFFICERS WHO SATISFY ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

21 (A) ARE RETIRED FEDERAL AGENTS OR RETIRED STATE, MUNICIPAL
22 OR MILITARY POLICE OFFICERS.

23 (B) ARE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS OF THE SCHOOL ENTITY OR
24 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.

25 (C) ARE COMPENSATED ON AN HOURLY BASIS AND RECEIVE NO OTHER
26 COMPENSATION OR FRINGE BENEFITS FROM THE SCHOOL ENTITY OR
27 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.

28 (D) HAVE COMPLETED SUCH ANNUAL TRAINING AS SHALL BE REQUIRED
29 BY THE MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS' EDUCATION AND TRAINING
30 COMMISSION PURSUANT TO 53 PA.C.S. CH. 21 SUBCH. D (RELATING TO

1 MUNICIPAL POLICE EDUCATION AND TRAINING) .

2 (E) ARE IN SATISFACTION OF THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 111.

3 (F) [HAVE] IN THE CASE OF A SCHOOL ENTITY, HAVE BEEN
4 INDEMNIFIED BY THE SCHOOL ENTITY PURSUANT TO 42 PA.C.S. § 8548
5 (RELATING TO INDEMNITY) .

6 (G) ARE UTILIZED BY A SCHOOL ENTITY OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL THAT
7 HAS NOT EMPLOYED A SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER WITHIN THE THREE YEARS
8 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS CLAUSE.

9 NOTHING IN THIS CLAUSE SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO IMPACT ON GRANT
10 DECISIONS FOR SCHOOL ENTITIES [AND], MUNICIPALITIES OR LOCAL LAW
11 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES THAT APPLY FOR FUNDING FOR HIRING OF SCHOOL
12 RESOURCE OFFICERS PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (C.1) .

13 (3) THE OFFICE SHALL PROVIDE ALL TARGETED GRANT AGREEMENTS
14 TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S COMPTROLLER FOR REVIEW AND
15 APPROVAL PRIOR TO AWARDING THE GRANT. THE SCHOOL ENTITY [OR], OR
16 MUNICIPALITY, LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OR APPROVED VENDOR
17 SHALL PROVIDE THE OFFICE WITH FULL AND COMPLETE ACCESS TO ALL
18 RECORDS RELATING TO THE PERFORMANCE OF THE GRANT, AND SHALL
19 SUBMIT, AT SUCH TIME AND IN SUCH FORM AS MAY BE PRESCRIBED,
20 TRUTHFUL AND ACCURATE INFORMATION THAT THE OFFICE MAY REQUIRE.
21 THE OFFICE SHALL CONDUCT A THOROUGH ANNUAL EVALUATION OF EACH
22 PROGRAM FOR WHICH A GRANT UNDER THIS SECTION IS MADE. THE OFFICE
23 SHALL SEEK REPAYMENT OF FUNDS IF IT DETERMINES THAT FUNDS WERE
24 NOT UTILIZED FOR THE ORIGINAL STATED PURPOSE.
