## A RESOLUTION

Commemorating July 27, 2013, as the 60th anniversary of the
Korean War Armistice and urging all government agencies and citizens to participate in ceremonies in honor of those Americans who fought and died in service to the United States in the Korean War.
WHEREAS, On June 25, 1950, North Korea invaded South Korea, initiating the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, On June 27, 1950, President Harry S. Truman deployed the 7th Fleet to waters off Taiwan to prevent the spread of the conflict in Korea to other Far East waters; and

WHEREAS, The United States led an international coalition of 22 countries against Communist forces; and

WHEREAS, More than 5.7 million Americans served in the armed forces during the Korean War, including 350,000 Pennsylvanians; and

WHEREAS, More than 103,000 Americans were wounded in the
Korean War; and
WHEREAS, The Korean War cost the lives of 36,916 Americans,

    WHEREAS, Korean War veterans missing in action include 8,177
    Americans; and
WHEREAS, On July 27, 1953, an armistice was signed in
Panmunjom, Korea; and
WHEREAS, July 27, 2013, is the 60th anniversary of the
signing of the Korean War Armistice; and
WHEREAS, It is appropriate to remember the sacrifice
Americans made in service to their country during the Korean War
and to raise awareness of the "Forgotten War"; therefore be it
RESOLVED, That the Senate commemorate July 27, 2013, as the
60th anniversary of the signing of the Korean War Armistice.
