A RESOLUTION

Declaring it to be in the interest of the citizens of this Commonwealth for the Department of Environmental Protection 2 to make full use of available technology to preserve clean 3 drinking water, guarantee public safety and minimize 4 environmental impacts associated with Pennsylvania's 5 production of oil and natural gas. 6 7 WHEREAS, Oil and gas exploration and production activities involve conventional and unconventional drilling through various 8 subsurface layers of shale and rock to produce oil and natural 10 gas; and 11 WHEREAS, The drilling industry production and flowback water, 12 as well as other drilling-related infrastructure and sources, are potentially impacted with naturally occurring radioactive 13 material (NORM) and technologically enhanced naturally occurring 14 15 radioactive material (TENORM); and 16 WHEREAS, The Department of Environmental Protection describes 17 TENORM as material that "consists of naturally occurring radioactive material whose radionuclide concentrations have been 18 19 increased above levels encountered in the natural state by human 20 activities"; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Equipment is available to expedite sampling and
- 2 analysis processes with means for accurate onsite sample
- 3 collection and material testing for radiation that satisfies
- 4 Federal and State regulations; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Using this technology for sampling and testing
- 6 purposes may reduce the Department of Environmental Protection's
- 7 transportation, collection, processing, preservation, analysis
- 8 and identification responsibilities, as well as more efficiently
- 9 utilize department staff resources; and
- 10 WHEREAS, This technology is also commercially available to
- 11 the oil and natural gas industry and its use allows for more
- 12 efficient internal safety compliance, ensuring safe working
- 13 conditions for those laborers in the hydraulic fracturing and
- 14 hauling process; and
- 15 WHEREAS, This equipment has been implemented in the fields of
- 16 homeland security, nuclear power and landfill monitoring;
- 17 therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Senate declare it to be in the interest of
- 19 the citizens of this Commonwealth for the Department of
- 20 Environmental Protection to make full use of available
- 21 technology to preserve clean drinking water, quarantee public
- 22 safety and minimize environmental impacts associated with
- 23 Pennsylvania's production of oil and natural gas.
