AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," further providing for Keystone Exams.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 121 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 9 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, added June 30,
- 10 2012 (P.L.684, No.82), is amended to read:
- 11 Section 121. Keystone Exams. -- (a) Subject to annual
- 12 appropriation, not later than the 2020-2021 school year, the
- 13 Department of Education shall develop and implement Keystone
- 14 Exams in the following subjects: algebra I, literature, biology,
- 15 English composition, algebra II, geometry, United States
- 16 history, chemistry, civics and government and world history. The
- 17 State Board of Education shall promulgate regulations, subject
- 18 to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the
- 19 "Regulatory Review Act," necessary to implement this section.

- 1 (b) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 2 <u>4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements) or 4.51</u>
- 3 <u>(relating to State assessment system) or any statute or</u>
- 4 regulation to the contrary, neither the Department of Education
- 5 <u>nor the State Board of Education may establish any minimum level</u>
- 6 of student performance on a Keystone Exam as a graduation
- 7 <u>requirement.</u>
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
