## AN ACT

Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), 1 entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice 2 of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of 3 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," 5 further providing for definitions and for pharmacy technician 6 registration, qualifications and supervision. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2 of the act of September 27, 1961 10 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by 11 12 adding clauses to read: 13 Section 2. Definitions. -- As used in this act: 14 \* \* \* 15 (19) "Pharmacy technician" means an individual who: 16 (i) is registered with the State Board of Pharmacy as a 17 pharmacy technician; and 18 (ii) may assist in the practice of pharmacy under the 19 immediate supervision of a licensed pharmacist after meeting the requirements of this act and the regulations promulgated under 20

- 2 (20) "Pharmacy technician trainee" means an individual who
- 3 has been issued a temporary permit by the State Board of
- 4 Pharmacy that authorizes the individual to perform the duties of
- 5 <u>a pharmacy technician under the immediate supervision of a</u>
- 6 <u>licensed pharmacist.</u>
- 7 (21) "Immediate supervision" means a level of control that
- 8 <u>assures that a pharmacist has the ultimate responsibility for</u>
- 9 accuracy, safety and patient outcome, regarding the actions of
- 10 pharmacy technicians and pharmacy technician trainees and the
- 11 <u>use of automation in a practice setting.</u>
- 12 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 13 <u>Section 3.3. Pharmacy Technician Registration</u>,
- 14 Qualifications and Supervision. -- (a) (1) A pharmacy technician
- 15 shall register with the board biennially on a form prescribed by
- 16 the board and pay a registration fee established by the board by
- 17 regulation. An individual must have an unrestricted registration
- 18 from the board to practice as a pharmacy technician or a
- 19 pharmacy technician trainee.
- 20 (2) A pharmacy technician shall be responsible to and under
- 21 the immediate supervision of a pharmacist licensed by the board.
- 22 (3) A registration for a pharmacy technician may not be
- 23 issued if the applicant is unfit or unable to practice under
- 24 <u>section 3(a)(2) or has been convicted of an offense described</u>
- 25 under section 3(a)(6) in this Commonwealth or another state.
- 26 (4) An applicant for pharmacy technician registration shall
- 27 meet the following:
- 28 (i) Be at least seventeen years of age and have a high
- 29 school diploma or equivalent.
- 30 (ii) Complete a board-approved training program for pharmacy

- 1 technicians.
- 2 (iii) Submit to a criminal history background check as
- 3 required by the board.
- 4 (b) An individual currently practicing as a pharmacy
- 5 technician on or before the effective date of this act shall not
- 6 be required to comply with subsection (a) (4) (i) and (ii).
- 7 (c) (1) The board shall renew, revoke or suspend the
- 8 registration of pharmacy technicians under regulations
- 9 promulgated by the board.
- 10 (2) This subsection is subject to 2 Pa.C.S. Chs. 5 Subch. A
- 11 <u>(relating to practice and procedure of Commonwealth agencies)</u>
- 12 and 7 Subch. A (relating to judicial review of Commonwealth
- 13 <u>agency action</u>).
- 14 (d) (1) Except as provided for in clause (2) or unless
- 15 ordered to do so by a court of proper jurisdiction, the board
- 16 may not reinstate the registration of an individual whose
- 17 registration to practice as a pharmacy technician has been
- 18 revoked or if the individual is unfit or unable to practice
- 19 under section 3(a)(2) or has been convicted of an offense
- 20 described under section 3(a)(6).
- 21 (2) If an individual desires to practice after revocation,
- 22 the individual must apply for registration after the lapse of a
- 23 <u>five-year period and in accordance with this section and</u>
- 24 regulations.
- 25 (e) (1) Upon the submission of a board-approved written
- 26 application, the board may issue a temporary permit to practice
- 27 <u>as a pharmacy technician to an applicant who has met the</u>
- 28 requirements of subsection (a) (1).
- 29 (2) The board shall issue only one temporary permit to an
- 30 applicant and the temporary permit shall expire one year after

- 1 the date of issue.
- 2 (3) Upon expiration, the temporary permit shall be promptly
- 3 returned by the applicant to the board.
- 4 (f) (1) A pharmacy technician shall wear a name tag that
- 5 clearly identifies the pharmacy technician with the title
- 6 <u>"registered pharmacy technician."</u>
- 7 (2) A holder of a temporary permit issued under subsection
- 8 (e) shall wear a name tag that clearly identifies the temporary
- 9 permit holder with the title "pharmacy technician trainee."
- 10 Section 3. No person is required to register as a pharmacy
- 11 technician under section 3.3 of the act until one year after the
- 12 board has promulgated final regulations.
- 13 Section 4. Within 18 months of the effective date of this
- 14 act, the board shall promulgate final regulations to implement
- 15 this act.
- 16 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
