AN ACT

- 1 Providing for certification of central service technicians;
- 2 imposing continuing education requirements on central service
- technicians; and providing for duties of hospitals and
- ambulatory surgical facilities and the Department of Health.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Central
- 9 Service Technician Certification Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Ambulatory surgical facility." As defined in section 802.1
- 15 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the
- 16 Health Care Facilities Act.
- 17 "Central service technician." A person who provides the
- 18 services of inspecting, assembling, decontamination,
- 19 preparation, packaging and sterilization of reusable medical

- 1 instruments or devices in a hospital or an ambulatory surgical
- 2 facility. This term does not include a dental assistant or an
- 3 individual who is licensed or regulated under the act of May 1,
- 4 1933 (P.L.216, No.76), known as The Dental Law.
- 5 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 6 "Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of the
- 7 act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care
- 8 Facilities Act.
- 9 "Hospital." As defined in section 802.1 of the act of July
- 10 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities
- 11 Act.
- 12 Section 3. Certification.
- 13 (a) Certification. -- No person shall function as a central
- 14 service technician and no hospital or ambulatory surgical
- 15 facility shall employ or otherwise contract for the services of
- 16 a central service technician, unless the person has successfully
- 17 passed a nationally accredited central service examination for
- 18 central service technicians and holds and maintains a central
- 19 service technician certification credential.
- 20 (b) Exemption. -- The certification requirement under
- 21 subsection (a) shall not apply to a person who has been employed
- 22 or otherwise contracted for services as a central service
- 23 technician in a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility for two
- 24 consecutive years occurring within the five years immediately
- 25 before the effective date of this section.
- 26 Section 4. Employment and continuing education.
- 27 (a) New employees. -- A central service technician who does
- 28 not meet the requirements under section 3 shall have 18 months
- 29 from the date of hire to comply with section 3.
- 30 (b) Continuing education. -- A person who qualifies to

- 1 function as a central service technician in a hospital or an
- 2 ambulatory surgical facility shall annually complete 10 hours of
- 3 continuing education to remain qualified as a central service
- 4 technician. The continuing education required under this
- 5 subsection shall be in areas related to the functions of a
- 6 central service technician.
- 7 (c) Facility responsibility.--
- 8 (1) A hospital or ambulatory surgical facility shall
- 9 maintain documentation to verify that a person meets the
- 10 certification requirements under section 3(a).
- 11 (2) If a person does not meet the certification
- requirements under section 3(a), a hospital or ambulatory
- 13 surgical facility shall maintain documentation of a central
- service technician's dates of employment or the contract
- period when the central service technician provided services
- to the hospital or ambulatory surgical facility to verify
- 17 that the central service technician meets the exemption
- 18 requirements under section 3(b).
- 19 Section 5. Health care practitioners.
- Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit a health
- 21 care practitioner from performing the tasks or functions of a
- 22 central service technician if the tasks or functions are within
- 23 the scope of practice of the health care practitioner.
- 24 Section 6. Departmental duties.
- The department shall administer the provisions of this act
- 26 and promulgate and adopt such regulations as may be necessary to
- 27 implement this act.
- 28 Section 7. Effective date.
- 29 This act shall take effect January 1, 2016.
