- 21 ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, OR IN ANY WOMEN'S
- 22 ORGANIZATION OFFICIALLY CONNECTED THEREWITH, DURING ANY WAR OR
- 23 ARMED CONFLICT IN WHICH THE UNITED STATES ENGAGED AND WHO WAS
- 24 RELEASED FROM ACTIVE DUTY UNDER HONORABLE CONDITIONS, OTHER THAN
- 25 FROM PERIODS OF ACTIVE DUTY FOR TRAINING, OR WITH AN HONORABLE
- 26 DISCHARGE FROM SUCH SERVICE, OR A PERSON WHO SO SERVED OR
- 27 HEREAFTER SERVES IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, OR IN
- 28 ANY WOMEN'S ORGANIZATION OFFICIALLY CONNECTED THEREWITH, SINCE

5	HAS BEEN CLASSIFIED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS
6	AFFAIRS' VETERANS BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION AS HAVING A PERMANENT
7	TOTAL DISABILITY AND IS A UNITED STATES CITIZEN.
8	"SURVIVING SPOUSE." A SPOUSE OF A DECEASED SOLDIER.
9	"VETERAN." AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS SERVED IN THE ARMED FORCES
10	OF THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING A RESERVE COMPONENT AND NATIONAL
11	GUARD, AND WHO HAS BEEN DISCHARGED OR RELEASED FROM THE SERVICE
12	UNDER CONDITIONS OTHER THAN DISHONORABLE.
13	"VETERANS' PREFERENCE EMPLOYMENT POLICY." A VOLUNTARY POLICY
14	ADOPTED BY A PRIVATE EMPLOYER FOR HIRING, PROMOTING OR RETAINING
15	<u>A VETERAN, A SPOUSE OF A DISABLED VETERAN OR A SURVIVING SPOUSE</u>
16	OVER ANOTHER QUALIFIED APPLICANT OR EMPLOYEE.
17	§ 7203. VETERANS' PREFERENCE PRIVATE EMPLOYMENT POLICY.
18	(A) AUTHORITYA PRIVATE EMPLOYER MAY ADOPT AND APPLY A
19	<u>VETERANS' PREFERENCE EMPLOYMENT POLICY.</u> <
20	(B) POLICYA VETERANS' PREFERENCE EMPLOYMENT POLICY SHALL:
21	(1) BE IN WRITING;
22	(2) REQUIRE THE INCLUSION OF A STATEMENT IN ANY JOB
23	POSTING THAT INDICATES THAT THE EMPLOYER HAS AND APPLIES A

4	A VETERAN, SPOUSE OF A DISABLED VETERAN OR SURVIVING SPOUSE
5	SHALL SUBMIT THE DD 214 OF THE VETERAN TO A PRIVATE EMPLOYER
6	WITH A VETERANS' PREFERENCE EMPLOYMENT POLICY FOR CONSIDERATION
7	BY THE EMPLOYER.

12 "State-affiliated entity." As defined in 62 Pa.C.S. § 103 13 (relating to definitions).

14 "Veteran." [An individual who served on active duty in the 15 United States Armed Forces, including any of the following:

16 (1) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was 17 discharged or released from the service under honorable 18 conditions.

19 (2) A reservist or member of the National Guard who
 20 completed an initial term of enlistment or qualifying period
 21 of service.

(3) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
disabled in the line of duty during training.] <u>An individual</u>
who served in the United States Armed Forces, including a
reserve component or the National Guard, and who was

27 than dishonorable.

10	<u>(d) Offenses</u>
11	(1) A person who fraudulently obtains a business fee
12	exemption commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
13	(2) A person assigning, transferring or attempting to
14	assign or transfer a business fee exemption or using or
15	attempting to use a business fee exemption contrary to this
16	section commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
17	(e) ReportingThe Department of State shall annually
18	determine the total number of business fee exemptions issued <
19	under this section. APPLIED FOR AND ISSUED AND THE TOTAL DOLLAR <
20	AMOUNT OF THE EXEMPTIONS UNDER THIS SECTION AND SUBMIT A REPORT
21	TO THE CHAIR AND MINORITY CHAIR OF THE VETERANS AFFAIRS AND
22	EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIR AND
23	MINORITY CHAIR OF THE VETERANS AFFAIRS AND EMERGENCY
24	PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THE
