AN ACT

Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, providing for waiver of fee for corrected or duplicate State documents. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 6123. Waiver of fee for corrected or duplicate State 9 documents. (a) Requirements for waiver. -- A person who satisfies the 10 following requirements is eligible for a waiver of fees under 11 12 subsections (b) and (c): 13 (1) The person has been granted relief under section 6107(b) (relating to hearings) or 6108 (relating to relief). 14 15 (2) The relief under paragraph (1) was granted no more than 90 days prior to the person applying for a waiver under 16

- 2 (3) As a result of the abuse which is the subject of the
- 3 relief under paragraph (1), the person does not have access
- 4 <u>to the original documents that are being replaced or</u>
- 5 corrected.
- 6 (a.1) Alternate requirements for waiver.--Alternatively, a
- 7 person who satisfies the following requirements is eligible for
- 8 waiver of fees under subsections (b) and (c):
- 9 (1) The person was the subject of abuse within the
- 10 <u>previous 120 days and the abuse is verified through one of</u>
- 11 the following methods:
- 12 (i) A statement by an employee, agent or volunteer
- of a victim service provider, an attorney, a medical
- 14 professional or a mental health professional from whom
- the victim has sought assistance relating to the abuse.
- (ii) A statement subject to 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904(b)
- 17 <u>(relating to unsworn falsification to authorities) from</u>
- the person. The provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. § 1104 (relating
- 19 <u>to sentence of imprisonment for misdemeanors) shall not</u>
- apply to a violation of this subparagraph.
- 21 (2) The person has not filed a petition for relief under
- 22 this chapter regarding the abuse under paragraph (1).
- 23 (3) As a result of the abuse under paragraph (1), the
- 24 person does not have access to the original documents that
- are being replaced or corrected.
- 26 (b) Waiver of fee by Department of Transportation.--Upon
- 27 application of a person who qualifies under subsection (a) or
- 28 (a.1), the Department of Transportation shall waive the fee for
- 29 <u>a duplicate or corrected certificate of title, photo</u>
- 30 identification card, noncommercial driver's license, commercial

- 1 driver's license, camera card, learner's permit or registration
- 2 card. A qualifying person with dependents shall also receive a
- 3 waiver of fee under this section for a duplicate or corrected
- 4 <u>document for the person's dependents.</u>
- 5 (c) Waiver of fee by Department of Health. -- Upon application
- 6 of a person who qualifies under subsection (a) or (a.1), the
- 7 Department of Health shall waive the fee for a certified copy of
- 8 <u>birth record</u>. A qualifying person with dependents shall also
- 9 <u>receive a waiver of fee under this section for a duplicate or</u>
- 10 corrected document for the person's dependents.
- 11 (d) Implementation by agencies. -- Within 90 days of the
- 12 <u>effective date of this section</u>, the Department of Transportation
- 13 <u>and the Department of Health shall establish a statement of</u>
- 14 policy providing for applications made under subsection (b) or
- 15 <u>(c), as applicable. A statement of policy under this subsection</u>
- 16 <u>must be made available on the agency's publicly accessible</u>
- 17 Internet website and must be reviewed by the agency at least
- 18 every five years.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
