AN ACT

- Amending the act of January 17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), entitled 1 "An act establishing a fixed minimum wage and overtime rates 2 for employes, with certain exceptions; providing for minimum 3 rates for learners and apprentices; creating a Minimum Wage Advisory Board and defining its powers and duties; conferring 5 powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Labor and 6 Industry; imposing duties on employers; and providing 7 penalties," further providing for minimum wages; providing 8 for reporting by the department; and repealing preemption provision. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 12 hereby enacts as follows:
- 13 Section 1. Section 4(a) of the act of January 17, 1968
- 14 (P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968, amended
- July 5, 2012 (P.L.987, No.109), is amended to read: 15
- Section 4. Minimum Wages. -- Except as may otherwise be 16
- 17 provided under this act:
- 18 (a) Every employer shall pay to each of his or her employes
- 19 wages for all hours worked at a rate of not less than:
- 20 Two dollars sixty-five cents (\$2.65) an hour upon the
- effective date of this amendment.

- 1 (2) Two dollars ninety cents (\$2.90) an hour during the year
- 2 beginning January 1, 1979.
- 3 (3) Three dollars ten cents (\$3.10) an hour during the year
- 4 beginning January 1, 1980.
- 5 (4) Three dollars thirty-five cents (\$3.35) an hour after
- 6 December 31, 1980.
- 7 (5) Three dollars seventy cents (\$3.70) an hour beginning
- 8 February 1, 1989.
- 9 (6) Five dollars fifteen cents (\$5.15) an hour beginning
- 10 September 1, 1997.
- 11 (7) Six dollars twenty-five cents (\$6.25) an hour beginning
- 12 January 1, 2007.
- 13 (8) Seven dollars fifteen cents (\$7.15) an hour beginning
- 14 July 1, 2007.
- 15 (9) Nine dollars (\$9) an hour beginning ninety days after
- 16 <u>the effective date of this paragraph.</u>
- 17 (10) Ten dollars fifty cents (\$10.50) an hour beginning
- 18 three hundred sixty-five days after the effective date of this
- 19 paragraph.
- 20 (11) Twelve dollars fifty cents (\$12.50) an hour beginning
- 21 seven hundred thirty days after the effective date of this
- 22 <u>paragraph</u>.
- 23 (12) Thirteen dollars fifty cents (\$13.50) an hour beginning
- 24 one thousand ninety-five days after the effective date of this
- 25 <u>paragraph</u>.
- 26 (13) Fifteen dollars (\$15) an hour beginning one thousand
- 27 <u>four hundred sixty days after the effective date of this</u>
- 28 paragraph.
- 29 (14) Beginning one year after the effective rate under
- 30 paragraph (13) becomes effective, and each succeeding year

- 1 thereafter, the minimum wage shall be increased by an annual
- 2 <u>cost-of-living adjustment calculated by applying the percentage</u>
- 3 change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-
- 4 <u>U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area,</u>
- 5 for the most recent twelve-month period for which figures have
- 6 been officially reported by the United States Department of
- 7 <u>Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics sixty days prior to the date</u>
- 8 the adjustment is due to take effect, to the then current
- 9 minimum wage amount and rounded to the nearest multiple of five
- 10 cents (5¢). The percentage increase and the minimum wage amounts
- 11 shall be determined by the secretary as herein prescribed and
- 12 <u>public notice given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin within ten days</u>
- 13 of the date such determination is made.

- 15 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 16 <u>Section 13.1. Reporting by Department.--The department shall</u>
- 17 collect information of the number of employers who violate the
- 18 provisions of this act, including the amount of fines imposed
- 19 for violations, and shall publish the information on the
- 20 <u>department's publicly accessible Internet website. The</u>
- 21 department shall update the information every six months.
- 22 Section 3. Section 14.1 of the act is repealed:
- 23 [Section 14.1. Preemption.--(a) Except as set forth in
- 24 subsection (b), this act shall preempt and supersede any local
- 25 ordinance or rule concerning the subject matter of this act.
- 26 (b) This section does not prohibit local regulation pursuant
- 27 to an ordinance which was adopted by a municipality prior to
- 28 January 1, 2006, and which remained in effect on January 1,
- 29 2006.]
- 30 Section 4. Any and all regulations are hereby abrogated to

- 1 the extent of any inconsistency with this act.
- 2 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
