## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for Italian and Americans 5 of Italian heritage cultural and educational programs and for 6 a transfer. 8 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows: 9 For the past several decades, Hollywood and the 10 communications media have continuously portrayed Italians and 11 Americans of Italian heritage as mobsters, buffoons and other 12 nefarious characters to such an extent that it appears to be 13 an orchestrated program of cultural dismemberment and disdain 14 which can and will promote ethnic bigotry and loss of 15 cultural identity. 16 The exposure of our children and others to this 17 unrelenting barrage of negative images has led to the erosion 18 and denigration of Italian-American culture, history and 19 heritage. It has, furthermore, encouraged children to emulate 20 negative role models and promoted the social acceptability of

- disrespect for and bigotry towards Italians and Americans of Italian heritage and their culture, history and heritage.
  - (3) The histories of our nation and this Commonwealth have been significantly enriched by the heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage. The cultural heritage of Italy includes the classical civilization of Rome, the fine arts of the Renaissance, the scientific and artistic genius of da Vinci, the literary works of Dante and Petrarch, the operas of Verdi and Puccini and many other contributions that have ennobled civilization.
    - (4) More than 5,400,000 Italians emigrated to the United States between 1820 and 1991. Our nation and this Commonwealth have benefited substantially from the influences and contributions of these men, women and children and their distinctive culture, history and heritage.
    - (5) It is desirable to educate our citizens about the positive aspects of the culture, music, art, language, history and heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian Heritage.
    - (6) It is the policy of the Commonwealth that the culture, history and heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage be a proper concern for all people, particularly students enrolled in the schools of this Commonwealth.
- 25 (7) It is appropriate and desirable that programs,
  26 workshops, institutes, seminars and other teacher-training
  27 activities for the study of the culture, history and heritage
  28 of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage be conducted at
  29 the various high schools and institutions of higher education
  30 in this Commonwealth.

- 1 (8) It is fitting and proper to establish a permanent
- 2 State-level commission to survey, design, encourage and
- 3 promote the implementation of Italian and Americans of
- 4 Italian heritage cultural and educational programs in this
- 5 Commonwealth, with responsibility for the coordination of
- 6 events that will provide appropriate awareness and
- 7 memorialization of the culture, history, heritage and
- 8 language of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage on a
- 9 regular basis throughout this Commonwealth.
- 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 11 hereby enacts as follows:
- 12 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 13 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
- 14 article to read:
- 15 <u>ARTICLE XV-H</u>
- 16 ITALIAN AND AMERICANS OF ITALIAN HERITAGE
- 17 CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS
- 18 Section 1501-H. Definitions.
- 19 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 20 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 21 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 22 "Commission." The Commission on Italian and Americans of
- 23 Italian Heritage Cultural and Educational Programs.
- 24 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- 26 "Institute." The Institute of Italian and Italian American
- 27 Heritage Studies.
- 28 <u>Section 1502-H. Commission on Italian and Americans of Italian</u>
- 29 <u>Heritage Cultural and Educational Programs.</u>
- 30 (a) Establishment. -- The Commission on Italian and Americans

- 1 of Italian Heritage Cultural and Educational Programs is
- 2 <u>established</u>. The commission shall be placed within the
- 3 department but shall be independent of supervision or control by
- 4 <u>the department.</u>
- 5 (b) Composition. -- The commission shall consist of the
- 6 <u>following members:</u>
- 7 (1) The Secretary of Education.
- 8 <u>(2) The following:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) Nine public members who shall be appointed by</u>
- the Governor. At least four of the members appointed
- 11 <u>under this subparagraph must, at the time of appointment,</u>
- 12 <u>have at least a master's degree in an area of Italian</u>
- 13 studies or language.
- 14 (ii) Five public members who shall be appointed by
- the President pro tempore of the Senate. At least one of
- the members appointed under this subparagraph must have a
- 17 master's degree in an area of Italian studies or
- language.
- 19 (iii) Five public members who shall be appointed by
- the Speaker of the House of Representatives. At least one
- of the members appointed under this subparagraph must
- have a master's degree in an area of Italian studies or
- language.
- 24 (c) Qualifications.--Each member must be a resident of this
- 25 Commonwealth who has served prominently as a spokesperson or
- 26 leader of an organization in the Italian and Americans of
- 27 <u>Italian heritage community which serves members of religious</u>,
- 28 ethnic, national heritage or social groups or who are
- 29 experienced in the field of Italian and Americans of Italian
- 30 heritage education. To the greatest extent practicable, the

- 1 members shall be chosen with due regard to afford the commission
- 2 with broad regional representation and ethnic diversity. At
- 3 least one-half of the public members must be of Italian descent.
- 4 (d) Terms.--

- 5 (1) Each public member shall serve for a term of three 6 years, except that of the initial members appointed:
- 7 (i) Two members appointed by the Governor, one
  8 member appointed by the President pro tempore of the
  9 Senate and one member appointed by the Speaker of the
  10 House of Representatives shall serve for terms of one
  - (ii) Three members appointed by the Governor, two
    members appointed by the President pro tempore of the
    Senate and one member appointed by the Speaker of the
    House of Representatives shall serve for terms of two
    years.
- 17 (iii) Four members appointed by the Governor, two

  18 members appointed by the President pro tempore of the

  19 Senate and one member appointed by the Speaker of the

  20 House of Representatives shall serve for terms of three

  21 years.
- 22 (2) A public member shall be eligible for reappointment.
- 23 (3) A public member shall serve until the public
- 24 member's successor is appointed and qualified. The term of
- 25 the successor of an incumbent member shall be calculated from
- 26 the expiration of the term of the incumbent. A vacancy
- 27 occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled in
- the same manner as the original appointment, except for the
- 29 <u>unexpired term only.</u>
- 30 (e) Compensation. -- The members shall:

- 1 (1) Serve without compensation.
- 2 (2) Be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses
- 3 incurred in the performance of the member's duties.
- 4 <u>(f) Chairperson.--The commission shall annually elect a</u>
- 5 <u>chairperson from among commission members.</u>
- 6 (g) Meetings. -- The commission shall meet upon the call of
- 7 the chairperson or a majority of the commission members.
- 8 (h) Quorum. -- The presence of a majority of the authorized
- 9 members of the commission shall be required for the conduct of
- 10 official business.
- 11 (i) Executive director. -- The commission shall appoint an
- 12 <u>executive director</u>, who shall serve at the pleasure of the
- 13 commission and shall be an individual qualified by training and
- 14 <u>experience to perform the duties of the office.</u>
- 15 Section 1503-H. Duties.
- The commission shall have the following duties:
- 17 (1) To provide, based upon the collective knowledge and
- 18 experience of the members, assistance and advice to the
- 19 <u>public and nonpublic schools of this Commonwealth with</u>
- 20 respect to the implementation of Italian and Americans of
- 21 <u>Italian heritage cultural and educational programs.</u>
- 22 (2) To meet with county and local school officials and
- 23 <u>other interested public and private organizations for the</u>
- 24 purpose of assisting with the planning, coordination or
- 25 modification of courses of study dealing with issues, matters
- and subjects concerning or relating to the culture, history
- 27 <u>and heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage.</u>
- 28 (3) To survey and catalog the extent and breadth of
- 29 Italian and Americans of Italian heritage cultural awareness
- and educational programs presently being incorporated into

1	the curricula and taught in the school systems of this
2	<pre>Commonwealth.</pre>
3	(4) To inventory Italian and Americans of Italian
4	heritage exhibits and resources which may be incorporated
5	into courses of study at various locations throughout this
6	Commonwealth and, upon request, to assist the department and
7	other educational agencies in the development and
8	implementation of Italian and Americans of Italian heritage
9	cultural awareness and educational programs. In furtherance
10	of this duty, the commission may contact and cooperate with
11	existing Italian and Americans of Italian heritage public or
12	private nonprofit resource organizations and may act as a
13	liaison concerning issues and topics involving and relating
14	to the culture, history and heritage of Italians and
15	Americans of Italian heritage to members of the General
16	Assembly and the Congress of the United States.
17	(5) To compile a roster of individual volunteers who are
18	willing to share their knowledge and experience in
19	classrooms, seminars and workshops on subjects concerning and
20	relating to the culture, history and heritage of Italians and
21	Americans of Italian heritage. The volunteers may be
22	scholars, members of the clergy, community relations
23	professionals and other individuals who, by virtue of their
24	experience, training or interest, have acquired personal or
25	academic knowledge of the culture, history and heritage of
26	Italians and Americans of Italian heritage and who are
27	willing to share that knowledge with students and teachers.
28	(6) To coordinate events observing the culture, history
29	and heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage
30	and to seek volunteers who are willing and able to

1 participate in commemorative events that enhance student

2 awareness of the significance of the culture, history and

3 heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage.

4 (7) To prepare reports for the Governor and the General
5 Assembly regarding the commission's findings and
6 recommendations to facilitate the inclusion of Italian and
7 Americans of Italian heritage studies and special programs
8 memorializing the culture, history and heritage of Italians
9 and Americans of Italian heritage in the educational system

(8) To develop, in consultation with the department, curriculum guidelines for the teaching of subjects and topics concerning and relating to the culture, history and heritage of Italians and Americans of Italian heritage. To the

16 <u>incorporate the guidelines as part of the curriculum for the</u>

greatest extent practicable, each school district shall

17 <u>school district's elementary and secondary school students.</u>

of a municipality or school district to supply data, program reports and other information, personnel and assistance, as the commission deems necessary to discharge the commission's responsibilities under this article. The departments and agencies shall, to the extent possible, cooperate with the commission and shall furnish the commission with information, personnel and assistance as may be necessary or helpful to accomplish the purposes of this article.

(10) To create, establish and oversee the Institute of

Italian and Italian-American Heritage Studies as an entity

whose purpose is to assist the commission in implementation

of the commission's responsibilities. The commission shall

of this Commonwealth.

- 1 <u>function as the board of governors for the institute and</u>
- 2 shall appoint an executive director of the institute who
- 3 shall serve at the commission's pleasure.
- 4 (11) To survey the four-year universities and colleges
- 5 <u>in this Commonwealth that have an advanced degree program in</u>
- 6 <u>the field of Italian and Italian-American studies and select</u>
- 7 one to serve as host to the institute. The institute shall
- 8 <u>not be administered by the college or university selected as</u>
- 9 <u>the host site. The institute must collaborate with and</u>
- 10 otherwise engage, share and exchange resources with the
- 11 <u>higher education community of this Commonwealth and work to</u>
- 12 <u>establish mutually beneficial public service programs and</u>
- 13 <u>activities consistent with the mission of the commission. The</u>
- 14 <u>institute may raise private funds and obtain public funds to</u>
- be used towards scholarships, grants and studies in the field
- of Italian and Italian-American studies.
- 17 (12) To appoint an advisory council to the commission
- 18 and institute. The advisory council shall consist of
- individuals who have served prominently as spokespersons for,
- or as leaders of, organizations in the Italian and Americans
- of Italian heritage community which serve members of
- 22 religious, ethnic, national heritage or social groups or who
- 23 <u>are experienced in the field of Italian and Americans of</u>
- 24 Italian heritage education.
- 25 Section 2. The amount of \$250,000 is transferred from the
- 26 General Fund to the Department of Education to enable the
- 27 Commission on Italian and Americans of Italian Heritage Cultural
- 28 and Educational Programs to effectuate the purposes of Article
- 29 XV-H of the act.
- 30 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
