## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing 2015 as the "Year of the Veteran in Pennsylvania" to
- 2 highlight and celebrate the accomplishments of veterans as
- 3 well as to continue to raise public awareness of issues
- 4 related to veterans and the ongoing initiatives to serve
- those who have served their country.
- 6 WHEREAS, Philadelphia is the birthplace of the United States
- 7 Army, United States Navy and United States Marine Corps,
- 8 establishing a link between our city and those who have served
- 9 our country dating back to pre-Revolutionary War times; and
- 10 WHEREAS, According to the Pennsylvania Department of Military
- 11 and Veterans Affairs, our active duty and retired military
- 12 personnel have an economic impact of \$1.5 billion in our
- 13 communities across this Commonwealth; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Veterans of past wars and peace time as well as

- 1 those returning from overseas military duty to this Commonwealth
- 2 are part of the foundation of our community; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Veterans have served our country in the armed forces
- 4 and put themselves in harm's way, without regard for their
- 5 personal safety, to protect us and preserve our liberties; and
- 6 WHEREAS, There are roughly one million veterans and their
- 7 families living in this Commonwealth with service spanning World
- 8 War II to the present, men and women of all races, religions,
- 9 ethnicity, gender identifications and physical abilities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Veterans offer our Commonwealth a talented and
- 11 experienced pool of leaders, workers and neighbors; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Many veterans face challenges living to their
- 13 fullest potential because of the injuries, both mental and
- 14 physical, suffered during their service; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans
- 16 Affairs provides resources and assistance to this Commonwealth's
- 17 military veterans and their families, providing quality care for
- 18 aging and disabled veterans; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Veterans' Trust Fund, benefiting veterans and
- 20 their families, has grown significantly thanks to generous
- 21 donations from residents of this Commonwealth who voluntarily
- 22 make a \$3 donation when applying for or renewing their driver's
- 23 license or renewing a motor vehicle registration; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The proceeds from the sale of the "Honoring our
- 25 Veterans" license plate have also contributed to the growth of
- 26 the Veterans' Trust Fund; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The Veterans' Trust Fund will sponsor the first ever
- 28 Veterans Appreciation Day on Saturday, October 10, 2015, at Fort
- 29 Indiantown Gap; and
- 30 WHEREAS, This one-day event is designed to provide veterans,

- 1 service members and their families with information on a wide
- 2 range of benefits and services that are available to them; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Philadelphia became the first city in America to
- 4 offer a tax credit to employers hiring returning veterans which
- 5 will be assessed and modified as needed in 2015; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize 2015 as
- 7 the "Year of the Veteran in Pennsylvania" to highlight and
- 8 celebrate the accomplishments of veterans as well as to continue
- 9 to raise public awareness of issues related to veterans and the
- 10 ongoing initiatives to serve those who have served their
- 11 country.
