A RESOLUTION

- Urging the President of the United States and Congress to pass the Permanent Department of Veterans Affairs Choice Card Act of 2015.
- WHEREAS, On August 5, 2015, Senator John McCain introduced
- 5 legislation that would make the Choice Program of the Department
- 6 of Veterans Affairs permanent, remove the 40-mile limit and make
- 7 all veterans eligible for the Choice Program; and
- 8 WHEREAS, On August 7, 2014, United States President Barack
- 9 Obama signed into law the Veterans Access, Choice, and
- 10 Accountability Act of 2014, which created the temporary three-
- 11 year Choice Program to improve veterans' access to health care
- 12 by allowing eligible veterans to use eligible health care
- 13 providers outside of the Veterans Affairs (VA) system; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The current Choice Program only considers veterans
- 15 who live more than 40 miles from the closest VA health care
- 16 facility or are told by their local VA medical facility that

- 1 they need to wait more than 30 days from their preferred date or
- 2 the date medically provided by their physicians to be eligible
- 3 to use approved non-VA health care providers; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Department of Veterans Affairs has been
- 5 reluctant in the implementation of the Choice Program and has
- 6 failed to aptly distribute and educate veterans about Choice
- 7 Cards; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Department of Veterans Affairs has restricted
- 9 veteran eligibility to receive the card and has removed critical
- 10 funding from the program altogether; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Many scandals erupted in 2014 due to health care
- 12 delays and appointment wait times at VA health facilities
- 13 throughout the nation; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In addition to allowing veterans to see a private
- 15 physician if they cannot get an appointment at a VA facility
- 16 within 30 days or if the veteran lives more than 40 miles from a
- 17 VA facility, the Permanent Department of Veterans Affairs Choice
- 18 Card Act of 2015 ensures that the specific and unique needs of
- 19 veterans are addressed; and
- 20 WHEREAS, As the Permanent Department of Veterans Affairs
- 21 Choice Card Act of 2015 will make the Choice Program permanent,
- 22 lingering uncertainty about this program will be removed,
- 23 leading to a faster implementation of private care options for
- 24 veterans; and
- 25 WHEREAS, On far too many occasions honorable veterans of the
- 26 United States Armed Forces have not been able to access quality
- 27 health care in a reasonable time frame; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 29 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the President and the
- 30 Pennsylvania Congressional Delegation to support the passage of

- 1 the Permanent Department of Veterans Affairs Choice Card Act of
- 2 2015; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 4 the President, to the presiding officers of each house of
- 5 Congress and to each member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
