## A RESOLUTION

- Designating March 30, 2016, as "Pennsylvania Female Veterans Day."
- 3 WHEREAS, Women have a long, courageous and often unrecognized
- 4 history in providing military service to our country; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Women traditionally served as nurses, typists and
- 6 clerks and in other support roles; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Prior to the Civil War, women who wanted to serve on
- 8 the front lines were forced to disguise themselves as men in
- 9 order to serve; and
- 10 WHEREAS, It was not until the end of World War I that women
- 11 were permitted to join the military, and even then it was only
- 12 during wartime; and
- 13 WHEREAS, With the passage of the Women's Armed Services

- 1 Integration Act in 1948, women were finally allowed to serve as
- 2 permanent members of the military and entitled to veterans
- 3 benefits; and
- 4 WHEREAS, In the last two decades, the value of women in the
- 5 military has continued to be recognized with landmark
- 6 achievements such as the first women to graduate from the
- 7 Virginia Military Institute and the Citadel, the first female
- 8 fighter pilots flying combat missions in Iraq and the first
- 9 woman to command a United States naval ship; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In 2015, we saw yet another extraordinary
- 11 achievement for women in the military with the first female
- 12 graduates of the Army's elite Ranger School as well as the
- 13 Department of Defense announcing that women will be fully
- 14 integrated into all positions, including combat positions,
- 15 throughout all the armed forces; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The number of United States female veterans totals
- 17 more than 2 million, a number which represents 10% of the total
- 18 of all United States veterans, with this Commonwealth's female
- 19 veterans numbered at 71,287; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The selflessness and bravery that these women
- 21 exhibit in keeping our country safe and protecting our freedoms
- 22 shall no longer go unrecognized; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Today we rightly salute the accomplishments of the
- 24 more than 71,000 female veterans living in this Commonwealth;
- 25 therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate March
- 27 30, 2016, as "Pennsylvania Female Veterans Day"; and be it
- 28 further
- 29 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 30 the Pennsylvania Commission on Women.
