A RESOLUTION

1	Designating the month of September 2016 as "Childhood Cancer
2	Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania, honoring those young people
3	who have lost their lives to childhood cancer, expressing
4	gratitude to the doctors and nurses who provide special care
5	to patients and families affected by childhood cancer, and
6	encouraging all residents to join the fight against childhood
7	cancer in this Commonwealth.
8	WHEREAS, Childhood cancers make up less than 1% of all
9	cancers diagnosed each year and childhood cancer rates have been
10	rising slightly for the past few decades; and
11	WHEREAS, Childhood cancer is the second leading cause of
12	death in children under the age of 15, exceeded only by
13	accidents, and about 1,250 children are expected to die of
14	cancer in 2016; and

WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that about
10,380 children in the United States under the age of 15 will be
diagnosed with cancer in 2016; and

WHEREAS, The potential years of life lost to childhood cancer and the potential years of life saved by treatment exceed all other cancers with the exception of breast cancer; and WHEREAS, Most children cannot be treated at a local hospital, and families must face the disruption of moving to receive treatment at a regional cancer center; and

10 WHEREAS, Because of major treatment advances in recent 11 decades, more than 80% of children with cancer now survive five 12 years or more; and

13 WHEREAS, This is a huge increase since the mid-1970s, when 14 the five-year survival rate was less than 60%; and

15 WHEREAS, Survival rates vary depending on the type of cancer 16 and other factors; and

WHEREAS, There is significant progress that still must be made with regard to childhood cancer treatment because there are many types of childhood cancer, and some varieties with lower survival rates are still very difficult to treat; and

21 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is a leader in the fight against and 22 treatment of childhood cancer with six Children's Oncology Group 23 hospitals, St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, The 24 Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Geisinger Medical Center, 25 Lehigh Valley Hospital - Muhlenburg, Hershey Medical Center and 26 Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh; and

27 WHEREAS, Two of only 10 institutions in the Pediatric Brain 28 Tumor Consortium are in Pennsylvania, The Children's Hospital of 29 Philadelphia and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, and Penn 30 State Hershey Children's Hospital is one of only 11 institutions

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nationwide in the Pediatric Oncology Experimental Therapeutic
Consortium; therefore be it

3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 4 month of September 2016 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in 5 Pennsylvania; and be it further

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor those young 7 people who have lost their lives to childhood cancer, express 8 gratitude to the doctors and nurses who provide special care to 9 patients and families affected by childhood cancer, and 10 encourage all residents to join the fight against childhood 11 cancer in this Commonwealth.

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
