14	Section 1. Section 1707-D(a) of the act of March 4, 1971
15	(P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, amended
16	July 2, 2012 (P.L.751, No.85), is amended to read:
17	Section 1707-D. Limitations.
18	(a) CapIn no case shall the aggregate amount of tax
19	credits awarded in any fiscal year under this article exceed
20	[\$60,000,000] <u>\$125,000,000</u> . The department may, in its
21	discretion, award in one fiscal year up to:
22	(1) Thirty percent of the dollar amount of film

1 production tax credits available to be awarded in the next
2 succeeding fiscal year.

3 (2) Twenty percent of the dollar amount of film
4 production tax credits available to be awarded in the second
5 successive fiscal year.

6 (3) Ten percent of the dollar amount of film production 7 tax credits available to be awarded in the third successive 8 fiscal year.

10 Section 2. The amendment of section 1707-D(a) shall apply to 11 fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2015.
