## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An 1 act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue 2 subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing 3 for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 5 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 6 further providing for civil penalties and license 7 suspension," providing for reporting of sanctions and 8 criminal proceedings and for temporary and automatic suspension. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. The act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), 14 entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee 15 to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional 16 17 and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 18 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 19 further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," 20 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 21 Section 2.1. Reporting of sanctions and criminal proceedings.

- 1 (a) Duty. -- An individual who holds a license, certificate or
- 2 registration issued by the Bureau of Professional and
- 3 Occupational Affairs Licensure shall, as a condition of
- 4 <u>licensure</u>, certification or registration, do all of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (1) Report to the appropriate licensing board or
- 7 <u>licensing commission a disciplinary action taken against the</u>
- 8 <u>licensee, certificate holder or registrant by a licensing</u>
- 9 <u>agency of another jurisdiction.</u>
- 10 (2) Report to the appropriate licensing board or
- licensing commission any arrest, indictment or conviction of
- the licensee, certificate holder or registrant.
- 13 (b) Time. -- A report under subsection (a) shall be made as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (1) Within 30 days of the imposition of the sanction
- under subsection (a) (1).
- 17 (2) Except as set forth in paragraph (3), within 30 days
- 18 of the earlier of:
- 19 (i) an arrest under subsection (a)(2); or
- 20 (ii) an indictment under subsection (a) (2).
- 21 (3) In the case of a criminal action under subsection
- 22 (a) (2) which is initiated prior to the effective date of this
- paragraph, within 30 days from the later of:
- (i) the date of conviction; or
- 25 (ii) the effective date of this paragraph.
- 26 (c) Sanctions.--A licensing board or licensing commission
- 27 shall take disciplinary action against a licensee, certificate
- 28 holder or registrant who violates this section.
- 29 <u>Section 3.1. Temporary and automatic suspension.</u>
- 30 (a) Temporary suspension. -- A licensing board or licensing

- 1 commission may temporarily suspend a license, certificate or
- 2 registration under circumstances as determined by the board or
- 3 <u>commission to be an immediate and clear danger to the public</u>
- 4 <u>health and safety. The board or commission shall issue an order</u>
- 5 to that effect without a hearing, but upon due notice, to the
- 6 <u>licensee or certificate holder concerned at his last known</u>
- 7 <u>address</u>, which shall include a written statement of all
- 8 <u>allegations against the licensee or certificate holder. The</u>
- 9 board or commission shall thereupon commence formal action to
- 10 suspend, revoke or restrict the license or certificate of the
- 11 person concerned as otherwise provided for by law. All actions
- 12 <u>shall be taken promptly and without delay.</u>
- 13 (b) Hearing. -- Within 30 days following the issuance of an
- 14 order temporarily suspending a license, the licensing board or
- 15 <u>licensing commission shall conduct or cause to be conducted a</u>
- 16 preliminary hearing to determine that there is a prima facie
- 17 case supporting the suspension. The licensee or certificate
- 18 holder whose license or certificate has been temporarily
- 19 <u>suspended may be present at the preliminary hearing and may be</u>
- 20 represented by counsel, cross-examine witnesses, inspect
- 21 physical evidence, call witnesses, offer evidence and testimony
- 22 and make a record of the proceedings. If it is determined that
- 23 there is not a prima facie case, the suspended license shall be
- 24 immediately restored. The temporary suspension shall remain in
- 25 effect until vacated by the board or commission, but in no event
- 26 longer than 180 days.
- 27 <u>(c) Automatic suspension.--A license or certificate issued</u>
- 28 by a licensing board or licensing commission shall automatically
- 29 <u>be suspended upon:</u>
- 30 (1) the legal commitment to an institution of a licensee

- or certificate holder because of mental incompetency from any
- 2 cause upon filing with the board or commission a certified
- 3 copy of the commitment; or
- 4 (2) conviction of a felony under the act of April 14,
- 5 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance,
- Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, or conviction of an offense
- 7 <u>under the laws of another jurisdiction, which, if committed</u>
- 8 <u>in this Commonwealth, would be a felony under The Controlled</u>
- 9 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
- 10 (d) Stay. -- Automatic suspension under subsection (c) shall
- 11 not be stayed pending any appeal of a conviction.
- 12 (e) Restoration. -- Restoration of a license or certificate
- 13 shall be made as provided by law in the case of revocation or
- 14 <u>suspension of the license or certificate.</u>
- (f) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term
- 16 "conviction" shall include a judgment, an admission of quilt or
- 17 a plea of nolo contendere.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
