AN ACT

- Amending the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), entitled "An act requiring the licensing of practitioners of 2 osteopathic medicine and surgery; regulating their practice; 3 providing for certain funds and penalties for violations and repeals," providing for visiting team physician. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. The act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act, is amended by adding a section to read: 10 11 Section 7.2. Visiting team physician. 12 (a) Licensure exemption. -- A physician who is licensed in good standing to practice in another state shall be exempt from 13 14 the licensure requirements of this act while practicing in this 15 Commonwealth if either of the following apply:
- 16 <u>(1) The physician has a written or oral agreement with a</u>
- 17 <u>sports team to provide care to the team members and coaching</u>
- 18 staff traveling with the team for a specific sporting event

1	to take place in this Commonwealth.
2	(2) The physician has been invited by a national sport
3	governing body to provide services to team members and
4	coaching staff at a national sport training center in this
5	Commonwealth or to provide services at an event or
6	competition in this Commonwealth which is sanctioned by the
7	national sport governing body so long as:
8	(i) The physician's practice is limited to that
9	required by the national sport governing body.
10	(ii) The services provided by the physician must be
11	within the area of the physician's competence.
12	(b) LimitationsA physician who is exempt under subsection
13	(a) from licensure may not:
14	(1) Provide care or consultation to any person residing
15	in this Commonwealth other than a person delineated in
16	subsection (a) or as otherwise provided by State law.
17	(2) Practice at a health care clinic or health care
18	facility including an acute care facility.
19	(c) DurationAn exemption under subsection (a) shall be
20	valid for the following duration:
21	(1) An exemption under subsection (a)(1) shall remain in
22	force while the physician is traveling with the sports team
23	but shall be no longer than ten days in duration per sporting
24	event. A maximum of 20 additional days per sporting event may
25	be granted upon prior request to the board by the physician
26	but may not exceed 30 days total.
27	(2) An exemption under subsection (a)(2) shall remain in
28	force during the time certified by the national sport
29	governing body. The exemption may not exceed 30 days.

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(d) Agreements with other states. -- The board may enter into

- 1 agreements with the medical licensing boards of other states to
- 2 <u>implement the provisions of this section. Agreements may include</u>
- 3 procedures for reporting potential medical license violations.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
