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1 2 3	Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for voluntary veterans' preference in private employment.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

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- 1 § 7201. Scope of chapter.
- 2 This chapter relates to private employer's veterans'
- 3 preference policies.
- 4 § 7202. Legislative findings.
- 5 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 6 (1) The Commonwealth has a moral duty and obligation to
- 7 provide for and assist its military personnel and veterans,
- 8 <u>including new veterans returning from deployment in United</u>
- 9 <u>States military operations in places such as Iraq and</u>
- 10 Afghanistan.
- 11 (2) According to a 2014 annual report by the United
- 12 <u>States Bureau of Labor Statistics, this Commonwealth has an</u>
- 13 <u>unemployment rate of 4.7% for veterans, while 44.3% of</u>
- 14 <u>veterans were employed, which trailed the national average of</u>
- 15 47.9%.
- 16 <u>(3) While the Commonwealth offers veterans' preference</u>
- in public employment, a similar preference does not exist for
- 18 private employers.
- 19 (4) Twenty states have enacted legislation authorizing a
- veterans' preference by private employers. The Commonwealth
- 21 should follow this emerging trend.
- 22 (5) Many states that have enacted similar legislation
- 23 have lower veteran unemployment rates and higher percentages
- of employed veterans than this Commonwealth.
- 25 (6) The Commonwealth has a duty to help ease the
- transition back to society for veterans, and allowing private
- 27 businesses to apply a veterans' preference employment policy
- 28 would assist more veterans in obtaining employment.
- 29 <u>§ 7203.</u> Definitions.
- 30 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

- 1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 3 "DD 214." A United States Department of Defense Report of
- 4 <u>Separation Form 214 or a similarly effective form issued by the</u>
- 5 Department of Defense relating to separation from military
- 6 service.
- 7 <u>"Private employer." A sole proprietor, corporation,</u>
- 8 partnership, limited liability company or any other legal
- 9 <u>entity</u>, <u>including nonprofits</u>, <u>with more than one employee</u>.
- "Spouse of a disabled veteran." The spouse of a veteran who
- 11 <u>has been classified by the United States Department of Veterans</u>
- 12 Affairs' Veterans Benefits Administration as having a permanent
- 13 total disability and is a United States citizen.
- "Surviving spouse." A spouse of a deceased veteran who is
- 15 married to the veteran prior to or on the effective date of this
- 16 section and who is a United States citizen.
- 17 "Veteran." An individual who served in any of the following
- 18 and was released under honorable conditions:
- 19 (1) the United States Armed Forces;
- 20 (2) any women's organization officially connected with
- 21 the United States Armed Forces; or
- 22 (3) the Pennsylvania National Guard.
- 23 "Veterans' preference employment policy." A voluntary policy
- 24 adopted by a private employer for hiring, promoting or retaining
- 25 <u>a veteran, a spouse of a disabled veteran or a surviving spouse</u>
- 26 over another qualified applicant or employee.
- 27 § 7204. Veterans' preference private employment policy.
- 28 (a) Authority.--A private employer may adopt and apply a
- 29 veterans' employment policy.
- 30 (b) Policy.--A veterans' preference employment policy shall:

- 1 (1) be in writing;
- 2 (2) require the inclusion of a statement in any job
- 3 posting that indicates that the employer has and applies a
- 4 <u>veterans' preference employment policy;</u>
- 5 (3) be provided to the applicant at time of hiring and
- 6 provided to all employees on an annual basis; and
- 7 (4) be applied uniformly to employment decisions
- 8 <u>regarding:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) the hiring of new applicants;</u>
- 10 <u>(ii)</u> the promotion of current employees; and
- 11 (iii) the retention of employees during a reduction
- in the workforce.
- 13 § 7205. Eligibility for preference.
- 14 <u>A veteran, spouse of a disabled veteran or surviving spouse</u>
- 15 shall submit the DD 214 of the veteran to a private employer
- 16 with a veterans' preference employment policy for consideration
- 17 by the employer.
- 18 § 7206. Nonviolation of equal opportunity laws.
- 19 A voluntary veterans' preference employment policy adopted
- 20 and applied in accordance with this chapter shall not be
- 21 considered a violation of any State or local equal employment
- 22 opportunity law.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
